
Dear parents and carers,


Brace yourselves - it's a big one!
It's hard to believe that Term 1 is already drawing to a close. Whilst we were all able to catch up on some much needed rest and relaxation over the Easter long weekend, an extended break will be welcomed by our hard-working students and dedicated staff. It has been a brilliantly positive term with students settling beautifully into new classes and forming new connections with peers and teachers.

This term, the school introduced a Year 4 overnight excursion to Camp Collaroy, which I had the pleasure of attending. Stage 3 ventured out on a 3 day Sport and Recreation camp to Fitzroy Falls.

Students had the opportunity to explore the outdoors, fostering a deeper connection with nature and promoting physical activity. Camp provided opportunities for students to engage in team-building activities and challenges, enhancing social skills, collaboration and resilience. Well done to our Years 4-6 students for being brave and representing our school with pride!















Whilst the campers were kept active outside of the school grounds, our Years K-3 students were busy showcasing their headwear during the annual Hat Parade! The rain didn't dampen spirits as the ever-flexible staff and students quickly pivoted, moving the event to the school hall. Thanks to our families for helping with the hats at home - there are some very creative designers amongst the Bondi crew!

Our representative PSSA teams have been taking on local schools in the summer basketball and touch football competitions. We are pleased to be expanding our PSSA program for the winter, with the majority of our Years 3-6 students participating in soccer, netball, rugby league and AFL in Terms 2 and 3. What a talented team of coaching staff we have to be able to offer all of these options for our athletic and enthusiastic students!

This week we welcomed students from Bronte and Vaucluse Public Schools as they joined some Bondi Public students to participate in G.A.T.E.WAYS (Gifted and Talented Education) Science and Investigations: Curious & Curiouser workshops. Students were nominated by teachers (as per process) to participate in the workshops. Next term we will again host the workshops, but the subject area focus will be English, with the facilitation of Language and Literature workshops.

This term our Yarn Time students met fortnightly to connect and spend time in our garden with family and teachers. We were lucky enough to have Aunty Calita and Karen join our students for an Acknowledgement of Country workshop. Students worked together to form an updated Bondi Public School Acknowledgement of Country which will be launched at a Monday morning assembly early next term. Congratulations and thank you to our Yarn Time students, Miss Devenish and the team involved!

Although we have many exciting extra-curricular opportunities for our students, teaching and learning in our core subjects - English and mathematics - remains our focus and priority. Years 3-6 have been engaging with a new curriculum and Year 1 and Year 2 students have been continuing on their new curriculum journey from 2023. Kindergarten students have been busy getting to know new school routines, how to find everything around the school, learning the names of all of their new friends and.... they are already learning to read, write and count up to big numbers! Well done, to all of our Bondi learners!

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The Importance of Sleep for our Children

During Week 8, I was lucky enough to join around 50 principals from the Bondi and Port Jackson networks at the annual Primary Principals Conference at Terrigal. The theme was *Wonder, Wellness, Wisdom* and we delved into the critical intersection of diet, sleep, and general wellness in the context of post-pandemic health. Emerging research reveals the profound impact of the COVID-19 era on children, highlighting an array of health issues and heightened anxiety levels. Our conference theme was strategically crafted to address these challenges head-on, recognising that a child's well-being is intricately connected to their ability to learn and thrive in an educational environment. By understanding and addressing the impact of disrupted routines and increased stress on children's health, the aim was to equip educators and school leaders with the tools necessary to create a supportive and nurturing educational ecosystem.

Something that particularly stood out for me was the importance of sleep for children and the significant impact of lack of sleep on student learning.

Some useful tips for parents that were provided include:

- Make sleep a health priority and set and adhere to consistent bed times for you and your children.
- Know how your child is using digital devices and set boundaries (ie. screen time limits, removal of devices from bedrooms before bedtime or no devices in bedrooms altogether if this is possible).
- Talk to your child's teacher is your child presenting as tired at school?
- Talk to your child about the importance of sleep for health and wellbeing.
- Create a sleep-supportive home environment and encourage quiet activities before bedtime.
- Make sure children's activities, including homework, can be completed without interfering with bedtime.
- For children aged 6-13 years, parents should aim for optimal hours of sleep between 9 and 11 hours a night (7-8 hours is minimal).

I hope these tips are useful!



Jewellery and Socks

Whilst uniform consistency has certainly improved, we have recently seen an increase in students wearing dangly and hoop earrings, necklaces and bracelets to school. These items pose safety risks (not to mention heartbreak when they are broken or lost) and should be saved for wearing outside of school hours. Please note that the Student Dress Code details sleeper and stud earrings, and watches (not smart watches) as the only jewellery to be worn to school. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. We also wish to respectfully remind families that all-black crew-length socks are the only socks now part of our uniform. Please see the Student Dress Code below my post, for full uniform guidelines for families.

Time to Switch Off

As part of the recent release of the Department of Education's *Expectations for Digital Communications Procedure (2024)*, principals have been asked to establish, promote and maintain communication expectations for employees, parents, carers and



communities, in line with the 4 principles of switching off under the <u>Expectations for Digital Communication Procedure</u>.

The Department and principals will commit to not sending non-emergency digital communication outside of school operating hours.

It is important we let our community know that we do not expect our teachers to respond to non-emergency emails or other digital communications outside of school operating hours. We want teachers to be able to have control over their workload, to switch off from digital technologies in their rest periods to recharge and spend quality time with their friends, family and communities so they can bring their best, creative selves to work.



Road Safety

We ask that our students and parents are vigilant with road safety and considerate of others at drop off and pick up times - as drivers, passengers and pedestrians. We ask that all road rules are obeyed outside of our school (and always) and that parents slow down and pay close attention to all of the movement around the school.

It has been observed by staff that many students are arriving at school on scooters and bikes without helmets. Even if students are accompanied by their parents, they need to be wearing helmets and it's important we work in partnership in instilling the same safety messages. If students are heading home on scooters or bikes and they don't have helmets, they will be asked to walk their scooter/bike home or leave it at school. Thanks for your cooperation with this.

We say HELLO to SchoolBytes and GOODBYE to Dojo and Sentral

In streamlining communication, keeping data secure and as communicated in our Week 3 newsletter, we have an exciting change coming. From DAY ONE of next term, the school will be utilising Department endorsed SchoolBytes as our primary source of communication and data collection. SchoolBytes will serve as a one stop shop - absences, permission notes, payments, reports and communication.

Dojo will no longer be utilised, Sentral will be phased out and we aim to decrease the volume of emails. Even though Dojo will no longer be used for communication after the final day of school this term, we will leave it active until Friday May 3rd to allow families to access photos and past communications/posts. Don't worry - we'll have a countdown!

In preparation for the move to SchoolBytes, we ask that all families download the SchoolBytes App and switch notifications ON:

We understand that this is quite a transition for the school but we are confident it is the best way forward and in time the whole community will be able to see the benefits. We appreciate everyone's patience as we navigate our way through the changeover.

Wellbeing Programs - Term 2

In response to student need, we are excited to be launching two new Wellbeing Programs for our students next term. We will be introducing two small group programs for targeted students - Seasons for Growth and Aussie Optimism.

Seasons for Growth is an education program that builds the resilience and wellbeing of children who have recently experienced loss due to death, family separation or migration. Seasons for Growth aims to support young people to understand their feelings, help them develop skills for coping, restore self-confidence and educate them about the grief process.

Aussie Optimism comprises six programs, each developmentally appropriate for the different year levels. Aussie Optimism is based on psychological and educational research into the risk and protective factors associated with psychological difficulties, and anxiety and depression in particular. The program focuses on developing competencies, resilience and practical skills.

We are thrilled to be welcoming Assistant Principal/teacher Ms Libby Tulip back from maternity leave next term. Ms Tulip will be facilitating the programs on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons with identified students. The programs each run for a term, meaning 3 rounds of students will be able to participate for each program. If you have any questions, please contact Ms Tulip through the

Bondi Public School Student Dress Code

est. 2023 in consultation with key stakeholders

Rationale:

The NSW Department of Education requires that schools set local school uniform requirements. The Department supports the wearing of school uniform, which promotes a sense of belonging for students and creates a positive identity for the school community. School uniforms also contribute to the personal safety of students by allowing easier recognition of students inside the school and in the community. Schools expect students to wear the uniform during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when engaged in school activities out of school hours.

Aims:

- To promote participation, equity and inclusion amongst all students
- To offer choice and support gender diversity
- To further develop students' sense of belonging through building pride in, and identification with our school.
- To offer durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation:

After consultation with the school staff, the P & C and the Student Representative Council, the school is proud to implement a Dress Code that promotes consistency, provides choice for the students, allows for students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial constraints of families. School uniform items have been carefully selected by the uniform committee following consultation periods with all stakeholders in the school community over a number of years.

- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.
- Summer and Winter uniforms, as well as sports uniforms are prescribed, and are required to be worn.
- During Terms 1 & 4, Summer uniforms are worn. During Terms 2 and 3, Winter uniforms are worn.
- Year 6 polo shirts can be worn on non-sports days as part of leadership incentive and pride.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, plus watches (not SMART watches) are the only acceptable jewellery for safety reasons.
- The BPS sports uniform is also the school's excursion uniform and must be worn when leaving the school
 for the day.
- Hair ties, ribbons, headbands etc. are to be black or white, or teal for sports days.
- The only headwear that is acceptable is our sunsmart BPS hat. Hats must be worn outside during recess, lunch, sport and any other outside activity including excursions.
- The P&C operates the school **Uniform Shop** and also operates a second hand uniform pool for parents.
- The BPS Dress Code will be published in the newsletter each term.
- Parents seeking exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, or health conditions must apply in writing to the principal.
- Financial support and a clothing pool is available for families who require financial support. Families should seek support from the principal.
- Students not wearing full school uniform may be issued with a notification that will need to be acknowledged by parents/carers.

The entire school community is responsible for the implementation of this Dress Code.

1T with Ms Tyler

Students in 1T have been incredibly busy learning across all aspects of the curriculum.

In writing, we have been exploring character traits within texts such as 'Spoon' by Amy Krouse Rosenthal and another favourite called 'The Good Egg' by Jory John. Learning about sentence structure, nouns and verbs and using interesting adjectives is making our writing very engaging to read. We have been inspired by nursery rhymes of the past and we even gave them a little revamp with our own special rhyming words which as you can imagine has led to a very funny discussion!

During mathematics sessions, 1T have been absolute superstars at completing their Fast 4 revision work quickly before moving into differentiated maths groupings. We have learnt about the importance of place value, learnt a few new strategies to help with combining and separating numbers and now we are very focussed on how we can group numbers and look for patterns when counting.

1T loves to keep learning outside of the classroom too and they especially enjoy the chance to cook in the kitchen using produce from the school garden. We loved making delicious focaccia bread and collecting the fresh rosemary and basil. 1T students have also been very creative artists, drawing and painting amazing Sydney Harbour artworks inspired by the style of Ken Done. There was a hum of excitement in the air as many were busy preparing to audition for a role in the K-2 musical.

During Harmony Week, we discussed the many cultures that are represented in 1T and we were so excited to dress up in clothes that represent who we are. Students learnt a lot about each other and about some places such as Scotland, England, Germany, France, Italy, the US and The Pacific Islands. 1T students are very proud of who they are and where their family originated from.

The past year has been filled with lots of challenges for our teachers as they have been navigating the changes associated with the new English curriculum, especially in the area of reading. The impact of these changes meant teachers have endured very long work days and sacrificed a lot of their own personal time to learn more about evidence based reading instruction, to reorganise thousands of readers and create resources that support students to receive high quality reading instruction.

So the next time you see a teacher at morning lines or afternoon pick up, I strongly encourage you to take a minute to greet them with a smile and thank them for their tireless efforts. Thank them for their persistence and determination and for their never ending capacity to multitask as a teacher and learner themselves in addition to their responsibility to teach your children on a daily basis. Thank you K-2 teachers. You are absolute superstars!

I look forward to sharing more information about reading in our 3-6 classrooms next term but until then here are a few wonderful examples of ways you can help your younger children to read more effectively at home:

You can help your Kindergarten child at home by:

- running your finger under the words as you are reading with your child
- making sure your child can see how your finger moves from the end of a line to the beginning of the next line in a 'return sweep'
- using different voices to show different characters are speaking when you see speech marks

You can help your Year 1 or Year 2 child at home by:

- reading a range of literature aloud for rich experience; selecting texts that offer a wide exposure to new words, language and text structures
- showing how to read in a steady manner with expression
- listening to your child read familiar texts so they can practise an expressive voice with confidence
- encouraging them to ask you questions about the book if they are unsure about word meanings or the storyline
- talking and relating familiar experiences about a topic in a book you are reading, such as moving house, welcoming a new baby,




