The **Home School Liaison Officer** (HSLO) visited our school recently to check and monitor our school attendance records. Absences are regularly monitored by our staff and parents are notified when attendance rates drop below 85%. It is also a timely reminder to parents that they are required to explain partial and full-day absences promptly and within seven days.

Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Some absence explanations may be declined if it is believed that the absence is not in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances, that absence will be recorded as unjustified.

We will be closing Education Week with **Grandparents Day** tomorrow so if you are free please come along! There will be a special assembly starting at 9.15am followed by open classrooms at 10.15am. If you are able to donate a plate of treats for morning tea please deliver to the Hall from 8.30am.

We celebrated **NAIDOC Week** on Friday the 26th of July and it was another thrilling event. Our students enjoyed watching the Koomurri Aboriginal dance troupe and were dazzled by the smoking ceremonies they performed. Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) Committee announced the new names of our buildings and they were decided in consultation with our School Captains and Aunty Rhonda, a local aboriginal elder.

Our buildings will now be known as: Arabanoo, Bibola, Cooee and Dharug.

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An easy way to remember the new names is to look at the first letter – our old A Block is now the new Arabanoo building, the old B Block is now the new Bibola building and so on. We also commissioned some artwork from Zachary Bennett-Brook who owns Saltwater Dreamtime to hang at the entrance of each building. These will be presented to the school at tomorrow's assembly.

ROAD SAFETY INFORMATION

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR CHILDREN'S SAFETY WHEN THEY ARE TRAVELLING TO AND FROM SCHOOL.

Safe bus travel

A child is most at risk of harm just after getting off the bus.

To reduce risk:

- meet your children at the bus stop never on the opposite side of the road
- hold your children's hands at the bus stop
- stand a few steps back from the edge of the road when waiting at the bus stop
- wait until the bus has gone, then choose a safe place to cross the road.

Help your children to find a safe place to cross such as:

- at a pedestrian crossing or traffic lights, if available
- a clear section of road where they are visible to all traffic.

If you can't be with your children, organise for a trusted adult to meet them at the bus stop.



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

Individuals, couples and families from varied backgrounds and cultural groups are required.


Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are encouraged to apply.
