We are pleased to announce that over 100 second-hand coloured sports shirts have been donated to the Jilkminggan School in the Northern Territory. BPS parent Kelly Wright is founder of a charity called Deciding to Make a Difference which sees her regularly heading north to work with the remote Aboriginal community. The community is five hours south of Darwin and is home to 300 people, with 107 children enrolled at the school. At present a lot of the pupils attend school early to have breakfast and a shower so it's great the teachers will be able to hand the children the clean tops to be fresh for their day. They are so happy to be receiving the generous donation and will send some pictures to update us once they arrive. P&C news

It's a wrap for 2020!

While many of us will breathe a collective sigh of relief next Wednesday and look forward to a summer break, we should also reflect on how lucky we are to be part of such a strong school community.

The P&C Executive team of 2020 has thoroughly enjoyed the challenges that the past year has thrown up. We came together at the end of 2019 with a mix of experience and new faces to fill the key roles and set the direction for this year.

Our primary goal was to engage with the school community in a way that made every community member feel welcome and comfortable with participating and contributing to the school in whatever capacity they were capable. At the 2019 AGM a number of key projects and funding were discussed, and a number of operational areas were identified for focus including the uniform shop, online banking, financial reporting and completing the transition of the canteen from school to P&C management. It was also to be a fete year.

The year got off to a great start, we held a very productive and collaborative meeting in term one but was quickly turned on its head by the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. There was a high level of uncertainty around school operations, which directly impacted on our canteen and uniform shop.

As soon as it was confirmed that the school would transition to online learning the P&C Executive's primary focus shifted to protecting the school canteen and its staff. The Jobkeeper support payment was secured so that all our employees were paid throughout the lockdown period, and ensuring we were able to offer the same quality service when the school resumed face-to-face learning.

During this downtime, we were also able to address a number of key governance issues to ensure that the P&C, and specifically the canteen business, was compliant and meeting all of our legal obligations. All statutory payments, including superannuation, are up-to-date, automated payroll has been implemented, a break-even operating budget has been approved and most importantly the canteen employees are now properly protected. Standard employment contracts are now in place for most employees to ensure wage compliance and leave entitlements (with leave entitlements backdated to when they commenced employment in January 2018).

As a result, we not only have a great canteen but one that now meets all its obligations to the staff, P&C and the school. We thank Carolyn and the canteen team for their commitment to delivering healthy, nutritious and delicious food to our children. We also extend a big thank you to Sam Merrick for supporting the uniform shop while we were unable to have volunteers at school.

Despite the impact of Covid-19 restrictions on the P&C's calendar, a number of other achievements were also reported at this year's AGM, including:

- Purchase of STEM resources to have an immediate impact on the Makerspace (\$15K);
- Installation of drink bottle filling stations in the four main playground spaces;
- Funding of a new mural on the top playground;
- Completion of the new library shelving, co funded by the P&C;
- Short term improvements to, and deep cleaning of, student toilet blocks;
- Securing a NSW Government grant for \$22,500 for the outdoor classroom space;
- Keeping the Uniform Shop operational during the school shutdown period;
- Employment of a casual Uniform Shop Coordinator;
- Supporting staff and student wellbeing weeks over the year;
- Contribution of \$18K to the initial purchase of interactive whiteboards and a commitment to contribute further funds dependent on fundraising outcomes;
- Welcoming our new principal, Natalia Greguric; and
- Providing five representatives for teacher merit selection panels.

On behalf of the school community we thank our teaching and support staff for their incredible efforts to transition the school to online learning, and for the support, guidance and patience they gave us. Their innovation was inspiring.

Unfortunately, we were not able to hold our biennial Halloween fete which provides the majority of P&C fundraising. It was a real shame as it is such a wonderful community celebration. Despite this set back, fundraising efforts continued with a gofundme page and BPS memento tea towels, providing much needed funds of approximately \$25,000 which will be contributed to the outdoor classroom, Makerspace and interactive whiteboards. That we were able to raise such significant amounts in a year of so much uncertainty is testament to the resilience and generosity of our school community.

In recent years the P&C has had difficulty in getting people to volunteer for the key executive roles due to the time commitment and responsibility involved. This year, however, we saw a group of parents step forward and put their hands up for 2021. This allowed the existing executive to collectively make the decision to step down.

Each of the outgoing executives has thoroughly enjoyed their role this year and we look forward to supporting the P&C, school and community moving forward. It will take a lot of collective effort on the part of everyone to rebuild connections and reunite the community after such an unsettling year. We can't rely on a small group of parents to do that.

It will come down to the everyday interactions within the community, the sharing of ideas, tapping into the individual expertise we are lucky to have, and listening to each other. Most importantly, we

must set an example for our children on how to be active and positive community-minded citizens.

Congratulations and good luck to the new Executive office bearers. We encourage the community to support them in their new roles and to show appreciation – they are taking on lots of responsibility on behalf of the community. We wish you a safe and happy end to 2020, and hope that we are able to come together to celebrate our wonderful community in the new year.




Ethics classes need volunteers for next year






About the school


