Principal's Post

Dear parents and carers

It has been truly wonderful to see the majority of students settling into school routines. Thank you for ensuring your child/ren are ready for school each day and bring their best self as they walk through the gates. We often say, just like we explicitly teach literacy and numeracy skills, we teach expected behaviours and we are pleased to say that the students are coming to school ready to learn and grow. We have an amazing team of support staff to assist students with additional needs and we are thankful for everyone's support in achieving a positive start to 2021.

Mathematics

Every four years, schools review their programs in line with the use of evidence informed practices and student achievement data. Our data has indicated that we should be focusing on increasing the percentage of students in the top two NAPLAN bands in Numeracy, especially in the middle and upper primary years. The NSW Government Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation provides a toolkit called Evidence for Learning which is an online summary of educational research, designed to inform

practice by identifying the most effective approaches to improving student attainment. It references up-to-date international and domestic research and applies it to an Australian context. In line with the recommended research we have moved away from ability grouping across the Stage to a model of within class achievement grouping. The excerpt below from the Evidence for Learning website explains both models a little further:

Setting or Streaming (Ability grouping across the Grade or Stage)

Overall the effects are small, and it appears that setting or streaming is not an effective way to raise achievement for most students.

Setting or streaming may also have an impact on wider outcomes such as confidence. Some studies from the broader evidence base conclude that grouping students on the basis of achievement may have longer term negative effects on the attitudes and engagement of low attaining students, for example, by discouraging the belief that their achievement can be improved through effort.

Within class achievement grouping:

The evidence on within-class achievement grouping indicates that it is likely to be beneficial for all learners, providing an average benefit of three months' additional progress. However, there appears to be less benefit for lower attaining students than others.

Within-class achievement grouping may also have an impact on wider outcomes such as confidence. Some studies from the broader evidence base conclude that grouping students on the basis of achievement may have longer term negative effects on the attitudes and engagement of low attaining students, for example, by discouraging the belief that their achievement can be improved through effort.

On average, students experiencing setting or streaming make slightly less progress than students taught in mixed achievement classes.

Professional Learning for teachers and guidance for parents/carers

Throughout the year, teachers will be involved in professional learning to guide their work in evidence informed practices in Numeracy. We will also be running parent workshops in semester two to demonstrate how to help your child at home with numeracy. Meanwhile the Department of Education has launched The Everyday Maths Hub for parents and carers, aiming to support and encourage family conversations about the relevance and usefulness of mathematics in everyday life.






