Recruitment update: We have finalised the recruitment for our Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction position and I'm pleased to announce that Karen Albronda was the successful applicant. Karen will take on this position in a permanent capacity from the beginning of next year, while she continues to relieve in the position two days per week this year. As a recap here is the role description:

The Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction position is a leadership role dedicated to ensuring literacy and numeracy knowledge and skills are embedded in curriculum and assessment; high quality teaching practices are enhanced; and the capabilities of middle leaders are strengthened in literacy and numeracy instruction. The APC&I provides guidance and high impact professional learning to enhance teacher growth and development in literacy and numeracy. They work alongside teachers, co-planning and co-teaching in a continuous improvement process that seeks to uplift teaching skills and improve student outcomes.

We are still recruiting for a specialist philosophy teacher for the remainder of this year. I will inform you on the progress of this in next term's newsletter.

Uniform Update

Spotlight on Learning

4H with Mr Christensen (Wk 8)

It has been 'all hands on deck' this term in 4H! Our HSIE and literacy unit, which focuses on 14th-17th Century navigation and exploration has provided many opportunities for the students to read, write, paint and analyse primary and secondary sources from throughout history. The students collaboratively chose a navigator and used their researching and ICT skills to create an information text on their navigator of choice. In the images, we can see the journey that one student took from initial research, all the way to some excellently presented posters.


During reading, we have been focussing on comprehension strategies and understanding the important role that vocabulary plays in our understanding of texts. We have been keenly reading the novel "Jimmy Cook discovers 3rd Grade" and using the wonderful language of authors Kate and Jol Temple to analyse how growing your own personal vocabulary is key to becoming an excellent and critical reader.

In visual art, we have been combining the old with the new. With early navigation and 17th Century England as our stimulus, students have been using a range of techniques and colours to add a modern touch to some older portraits and structures.

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Spotlight on Learning

3T with Ms Thomson (Wk 8)

The incredible students of 3T have been sailing full speed ahead this term. They have been discovering and researching the great age of Asian and European exploration and navigation. This past fortnight they have been discovering primary and secondary sources of information for informative writing whilst learning about the way of life in 18th Century England before Australian colonisation.

During visual arts they created Father's Day cards that were out of this world and sketched threedimensional first fleet ships with precision, focussing on parallel lines and angles.

As part of the speaking and listening curriculum, topic talks have begun. Students have been presenting entertaining persuasive speeches this week involving huge amounts of preparation.

3T have been thoroughly enjoying learning their dance and have been practising to ensure it's ship-shape for "Bring it on, BONDI!" Take a bow 3T you have earned it!







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Spotlight on Learning

KD with Miss Devenish

KD has had a *magical* Term 3, exploring fairy tales during writing! Each week, students have read and learnt about a new fairy tale. Together, we discussed the characters, setting, and events of each story including a tricky problem to solve, and the resolution! Some favourites include *Blossom Possum*, *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*, and *Little Red Riding Hood*. Recently, students wrote letters to their favourite fairy tale characters, and posted them in our classroom letters boxes. We are waiting patiently for these characters to write back!

During mathematics, students practised using different materials to measure area. They learnt about the importance of measuring tools being the same size and shape, and needing to fill up the entire surface to accurately measure the area. Students estimated and compared the area of various classroom items.

During visual arts, KD recently began a multimedia art project which will include painting, drawing, and collaging. Last week, students used a variety of brush strokes to create a background for their artworks.

Students have also been working super hard to practise their dance as part of *Bring it on, Bondi!* Before Monday's performance we read the book *"Be Brave Little Penguin"* to help with the butterflies some students could feel in their tummies. We spoke about feeling both nervous *and* excited and how this can be a superpower!





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Spotlight on Learning

1W with Ms Wickham

1W have had an amazing term becoming explorers as we learnt about caring for Country in HSIE. As part of our geography unit on features of places, we were lucky to head to *Kamay Botany Bay National Park* and explore the local area. 1W learnt about the importance of Country to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and the significance of certain plants and what they are used for. We had a great time identifying natural and built features on our fun excursion.

In visual arts, 1W learnt about the Australian artist Pete Cromer and how he uses 2D shapes, collage and water colours to create different animals. We tapped into our inner artist by following instructions to create birds and jungle cats. We also made them our own by drawing a colourful background.

As part of our 'Sentence a Day' program this term, 1W have been learning how to write compound sentences. It has been fantastic to see students develop their writing skills and always trying their best.

1W have been superstars this term as we got ready to perform in *Bring it on, Bondi!* We danced and sang our hearts out, and thoroughly enjoyed the whole experience. You are amazing 1W!!







Stage 1 Excursion to Kamay Bay National Park

This term in Stage 1, as part of our geography unit, students have been learning about the features of places, how to care for them and the connections that people have to places, including First Nation Peoples. In Week 8, students in Stage 1 were provided with an opportunity to attend an excursion to Kamay Bay National Park, located in La Perouse.

Students boarded buses and arrived at Kamay Bay National Park, where they were greeted with a welcome to country ceremony, with traditional dancing. Students took part in various activities throughout the day that included Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander games, bush walks and beach activities, which consolidated students' learning of concepts taught in class, throughout the term.

Stage 1 students had a fun-filled day and were able to deepen their understanding of the features of places in our local area. The Stage 1 teachers would like to thank our parent helpers who attended with us, for all their support and assistance throughout the day! We look forward to providing many opportunities in future, for our students to take their learning beyond the four walls of the classroom.









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Stage 3 Dance Fever Interschool Challenge






CELEBRATING SUCCESS

Kai, our canteen manager, is on a mission to make the canteen more green so we are very proud that she has recently been able to eliminate plastic / bioplastic cups for all the drinks, yoghurt, fruit salad and veggie sticks.

The canteen is now using paper coffee cups from I Am Not Paper. Their coffee cups are not only plastic free (with a non-plastic lining inside the cup) but they are actually made out of plant fibre like wheat, corn, grass, sugarcane instead of tree paper, which is a big deal.

The lids are made out of plant pulp which means that cups and lids both are totally home compostable! As a bonus, that means there are no more STRAWS as well!
