2023 Class Formations

We have received some requests about classes for next year, therefore it is timely to explain how classes are formed. As you can imagine, accommodating all family requests around classes and friendships is logistically impossible.

We use our professional judgement to be fair and equitable to ALL students when creating groups that have positive social and learning dynamics.

Classes for 2023 will be formed with consideration to numbers, gender, age, social-emotional, learning and any other identified additional needs. From many years of experience, we have found that students thrive when given opportunities to form new friendships, and they will be supported to build those friendships. They will also have regular opportunities to engage with students in other classes. As a result, we cannot guarantee that students will be placed in the same class as friends.

If you feel that your child requires special consideration around class placement because of diagnosed additional needs or mental health challenges, please let your class teacher or Stage Assistant Principal know.

Spotlight on Learning



4P with Ms Moredoundt



Over the past two weeks, 4P has been a hive of activity. Students have been enthusiastically engaged in fun and exciting learning experiences with preparation for and participation in the Halloween Fete in the mix. In small groups and individually they made slime with parent volunteer Marieke. The slime helped 4P jointly win the best-dressed stall. It was an authentic hands-on way to learn about writing a procedural text which is one of our writing focuses this term.

Students have shown great enthusiasm and insight discussing and applying visual literacy skills to discover the allegorical nature of *The Rabbits* by Shaun Tan and John Marsden. They have been immersed in developing cultural awareness and a sense of caring for the natural world.

In maths one of our focus areas this fortnight has been multiplication and division. One of the students' favourite activities is the speed times table challenge. Students are determined to improve their time and accuracy.

4P love their garden lessons with Miss Nelly and were extremely lucky to have sensational weather for their recent session. They learned to read a seed label and how to choose the best place for each plant to thrive. We even planted our own class *Callistemon* (Bottlebrush) in the garden. Students have been learning about native Australian plants in H.S.I.E and integrating that knowledge into Visual Arts. They have created impressive artwork using pencil and watercolour.

Spotlight on Learning



1/2E with Ms Aravopoulos

ENGLISH

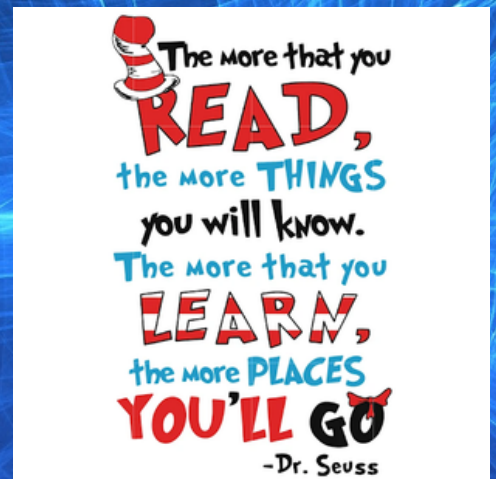
In **writing** this term, 1/2E have been learning how to plan, edit, draft and publish imaginative, persuasive and informative texts. Students have been learning how to use effective strategies to plan ideas for writing by making notes, drawing, using diagrams, planning a sequence of events or information. Students have also been focusing on using paragraphs effectively in their writing and how they are used to organise ideas. In addition to this, 1/2E have been experimenting with the use of quoted (direct) and reported (indirect) speech.

Quoted (direct) speech is used when we report what someone has said using quotation (speech) marks. Eg. "I live in the city," he said.

Reported (Indirect) speech is used when we report what someone has said without the use of quotation (speech) marks. Eg. He said he lived in the city.

Students practised and consolidated their understanding of quoted and reported speech by engaging with a screenplay from Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets (a personal favourite in 1/2E!).

In **reading**, students have been learning to read with expression and understanding. 1/2E used a text called 'Library Magician' and practised their reading skills with a partner. Students then provided feedback to their partner using the two stars and a wish strategy on how they could improve further. These goals (wishes) are visible and used in reading groups, so each student is aware of what they are working on, continuing to strive for academic excellence.



Stage Two Excursion to the National Maritime Museum

This semester in Stage 2, as part of our history unit, students have been learning about early explorers and navigation. In Week 9 last term, students in Stage 2 were provided with an opportunity to attend an excursion to The National Maritime Museum at Darling Harbour.

Students took part in various activities throughout the day that included a guided tour of the Maritime Museum and they went onboard a variety of vessels.

In the museum, students listened to stories about how adventurers navigated the ocean en-route to the Australian continent using traditional and scientific navigation techniques. Students examined navigational techniques of Indigenous people – Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, of the people from Papua New Guinea and other Pacific Islands, as well as Indonesian Macassan traders to the Dutch, Portuguese, Spanish, French and English explorers.

Students participated in a self guided tour of the HMAS Vampire (navy destroyer ship) and the HMAS Onslow which is a submarine.

The highlight of the day was the HMB Endeavour, whereby students learnt about the 18th century world of exploration through a guided tour of the vessel. They explored both above and below decks, from bow to stern. They listened to stories about life on board for the crew, marines, officers and gentlemen by viewing different parts of the ship including Cook's cabin.

The Stage 2 teachers would like to thank our parent helpers who attended with us, for all their support and assistance throughout the day!



THINKING & ACTING GLOBALLY

Dallas (4P) has been recognised by the NSW Department of Primary Industries for his idea to help protect the Grey Nurse shark. In Year 3, as part of a homework task, Dallas developed the idea for the 'Sea, Snap, Save' App which helped track sightings of the critically endangered shark. Last month, features of Dallas' app idea were added to the Department's FishSmart App. For his efforts, Dallas was contacted personally by the NSW Minister for Agriculture, recognising his idea and hard work. Well done Dallas!

PUBLIC SPEAKING



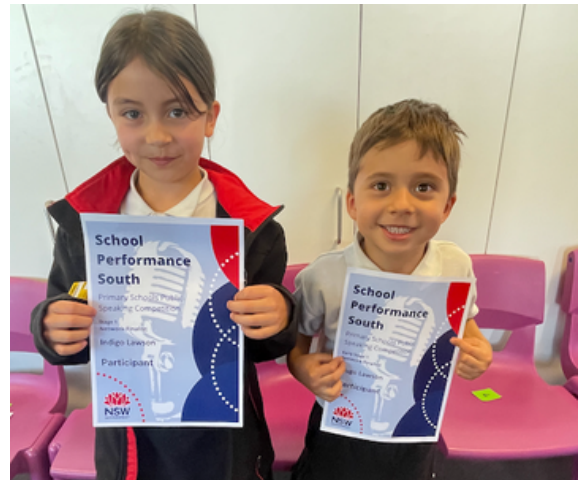

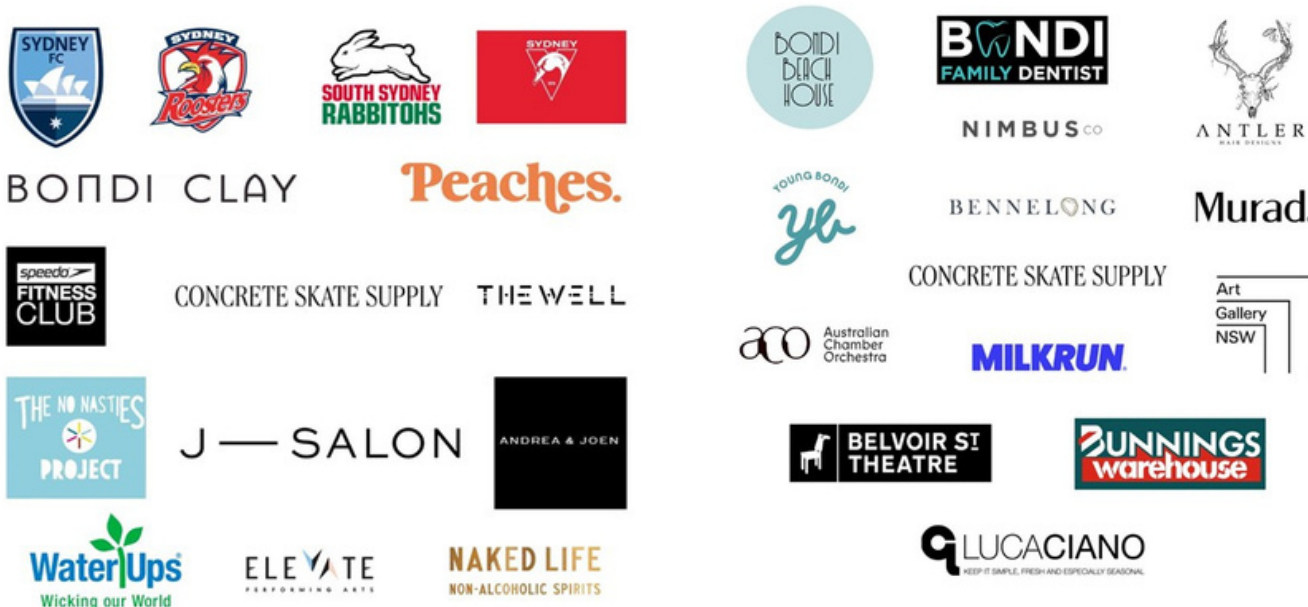

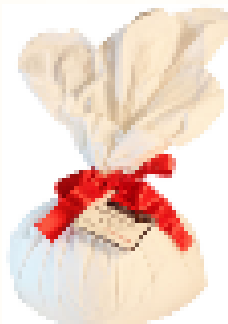
