

Semester 1 Reports

In recent weeks, teachers have been working hard in preparing student reports to parents which will go home in the last week of term. The reports are part of our assessment and reporting process and an integral component of the overall teaching and learning cycle.

Our teachers have been working in their stage teams to ensure our assessment practices allow every student to display their knowledge and skills in relation to the outcomes and content covered in classrooms this semester. We are aiming to provide parents with relevant and clear information about the performance and achievements of your child, in terms of both strengths and areas for development.

We have resumed using the A–E common grade scale <u>Year 1-10 Common Grade Scale</u> (5 point scale). The Common Grade Scale (A-E) is not required for Kindergarten students. Last year, due to the period of remote learning, schools used the 3 point scale for reporting purposes in Semester 2. Therefore the reports will look different this year because we have reverted back to the usual way of reporting. Sometimes, parents have questions about the report once it is distributed. Please reach out to your child's teacher to discuss the report either by phone or in person.

Challenging Times & Navigating Big Things

Now, more than ever, we are seeing an influx of school counsellor requests coming from families who are experiencing challenges in the home, for a variety of reasons. We have a school counsellor on site 2 days a week - her case load is prioritised each day she is in and she is unable to see all students referred, every week.



It's no secret that the past 2-3 years have had an impact on many families and in a variety of different ways. If you require support in navigating concerns around your child's wellbeing, advice with having tricky conversations around "big things" or general family support, we urge you to see your GP for a referral to an agency appropriate for your family's needs. Parenting in these times is tough - don't be afraid to seek support and have a discussion with the class teacher around how they can support your child at school.



Tell them From Me Student Survey

During Week 6, students in Years 4-6 participated in the Tell Them From Me Student Survey. The Tell Them From Me student survey provides school leaders with insights around student engagement, wellbeing and effective teaching practices at their school, from the perspective of students.

Leaders then use this information to guide staff and students in undertaking future school improvement measures. Surveys are anonymous and cover a broad range of subject areas: participation in sports and extracurricular activities, behaviour at school, effective learning time, use of ict for learning, homework behaviour, teaching relevance and rigour, sense of belonging, interest and motivation, perseverance, positive relationships, effort, experience of being bullied, valuing school outcomes, skills and learning challenge, advocacy at school, positive teacher – student relations, expectations for success and positive learning climate.

Usually I would put this information in the newsletter prior to students undertaking the survey, however this term due to a back-end administration complication, it wasn't possible - I do apologise.

Parents and staff will be asked to complete different versions of the Tell Them From Me Surveys next term and students will participate again towards the end of the year, so comparative data can be analysed. We appreciate your support and value your constructive feedback.

Spotlight on Learning

5/6M with Mr Maslanka



In 5/6M we have been working collaboratively in a number of key learning areas, sharing our collective knowledge to build on it further and develop new skills. In literacy groups, we have been looking at famous speeches and their persuasive devices. We have researched and annotated Kevin Rudd's "Sorry Day" speech extensively as well as Dr Martin Luther King Jr's famous "I Have a Dream" speech, to better understand how powerful persuasive devices can be and how we can use them to improve our own persuasive writing. Here you can see us annotating "I Have a Dream" by developing our own colour coding system and creating a Key for the reader, something we have also been working on during our maths lessons on mapping and position.


We have also been collaboratively researching the effect colonisation has had on our Indigenous population. In small groups, you can see us researching some of the early crimes committed against indigenous Australians during colonisation, particularly the Aboriginal peoples of NSW. This has helped us gain a greater perspective of our colonial past and its effect on our indigenous population and why historical steps such as Kevin Rudd's "Sorry Day" speech are so important for our nation moving forward into the future.

We have been having lots of fun combining the mathematical concepts of Area and, Position and Mapping, to create our very own theme park. We have to been hard at work creating a map that has a working scale that we can use as a tool to measure the area of our theme park rides and attractions. To make sure our rides and attractions area made sense we measured the basketball court and top field at school so that we could gather an idea of the relative size of objects before drawing them on the map. We also came up with our own coordinate system and key so that visitors to our park could easily find what they are looking for. We have really enjoyed using project based learning to develop these mathematical skills.

2S have been working extremely hard in all key learning areas this term.

We are absolutely LOVING our new Grow Your Mind unit where we are constantly learning about our emotions and positive ways that we can look after our mental health. Did you know that there are many ways to take care of your mind! Some of them include; moving your body, showing kindness to someone, laughing, sleeping, the list continues. One that we are doing everyday is "learning something new". On that note, to take care of our mind for the past 2 weeks we have been exploring Rube Goldberg and have been experimenting with complex contraptions to complete mini tasks. This involves working as a team to collaborate, illustrate, test and alter what is and isn't working to then come up with the best possible contraption.

We have also been exploring different types of narratives for our Imaginative Writing unit. We have been focusing on all of the different techniques that authors use to engage the reader. Some of the devices we have been focusing on include; onomatopoeias, the 5 +1 technique, similes and metaphors. Check out our great descriptive language wall!

In Maths, we have been focusing on being spectacular **maths learners!** In 2S, this is when we are challenging ourselves, learning from our mistakes, persevering and using the appropriate math strategies to answer given problems. In our whole number strand we have been getting outdoors and participating in place value relays! Staying fit during maths! Yes, it's possible!!

Step 5 - Click on the Blue Banner - 'Visit the PRC Student Site!'


Step 6 - Use the Yellow Banner - Discover books to read to search for titles either by year level or by Genre, or, click on the Blue Banner to search books by Title, Author, ISBN or Premier's Reading Challenge ID (PRC ID - then click add to reading log.


