Dear parents and carers,

Welcome to term 3. Firstly I would like to thank Anna O'Connor for relieving for me while I was on leave for the last week and a half. I am fortunate to be supported by a wonderful team of executive, teaching, support and office staff who are wholeheartedly committed to ensuring excellence for our students and community.

We have a number of construction projects in the pipeline which are being supported by School Infrastructure NSW and our wonderful P&C. In the coming weeks we look forward to sharing more information about our outdoor classroom and upgraded garden deck which are in the final stages of architectural/engineering approval. We recently had our play equipment on the top field removed and we are looking forward to getting students' voices involved in designing new play equipment which will be enjoyed for many years to come. Last term there was some material containing suspected asbestos found in soil in the Kindergarten playground area. I am sharing communication from School Infrastructure NSW about the next step in the process of ensuring the area is safe for students and staff.

Once this process has been completed we will commence an action plan to complete any recommended remediation and restoration work.



Education Week, Book Week and Student-Led Conferences

This year we are excited to be combining Education Week and Book Week. It will be held in Week 5 (15-19 August). We are also very pleased to be introducing Student Led Conferences to our Assessment and Reporting Schedule and Book/Education Week.

Student-Led Conferences (SLCs) provide a platform for students to discuss their learning and development, including goals, with their parents and carers. Student-led conferences create a link or partnership between the teacher, student, and parents to act as a support network or as stakeholders in the success of the student. Teachers help the students to prepare and organise the sessions and the sessions are then student driven. We will be setting up a booking platform to ensure families have the opportunity to participate in the SLCs on Wednesday 17 August between 3:15-6:00pm. SLCs will be 15 minutes in duration and only 3-4 families will be able to book per session. The booking link will be emailed next week. Book early to secure your spot!

Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction (APC&I)

This term we are recruiting for a brand new leadership position in the school, commencing in 2023, which is a Statewide initiative across all Department of Education schools. Karen Albronda is currently relieving in this position until the end of the year (2 days per week). The Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction position is a leadership role dedicated to ensuring literacy and numeracy knowledge and skills are embedded in curriculum and assessment; high quality teaching practices are enhanced; and the capabilities of middle leaders are strengthened in literacy and numeracy instruction. The APC&I provides guidance and high impact professional learning to enhance teacher growth and development in literacy and numeracy. They work alongside teachers, co-planning and co-teaching in a continuous improvement process that seeks to uplift teaching skills and improve student outcomes.



Police visit

Last term we arranged for our students to participate in an informative session about cyber safety with our local police youth liaison officer, Constable Brittney-Lee Bedford. This learning compliments the work we do around online safety at school. We appreciate the conversations you have at home with your children and here are some resources to further assist with this important learning.

Staff Professional Learning

MAPA Training

On the first staff development day of this term, all school staff participated in The Management of Actual or Potential Aggression (MAPA) training. MAPA training was identified as a need for school staff, by the Learning and Support Team to ensure all staff felt confident and capable in this area.

Staff were trained in verbal and non-verbal early intervention strategies to minimise the likelihood of anxious and disruptive student behaviours escalating.

Staff were provided with a framework for decision-making to prevent, de-escalate and safely respond to challenging student behaviours, within the context of Department policy.

Effective Reading in the Early Years

Late last term the Stage One team participated in the Effective Reading in the Early Years professional learning. Kindergarten teachers undertook the training in Term One.

Effective Reading in the Early Years is high impact, evidence-based professional learning, which aligns to the "What Works Best" document and supports our commitment to strong literacy outcomes for all students at Bondi Public School. It aims to support improved reading outcomes for all students, as strong literacy skills are the foundation for success as lifelong learners.

Middle Leadership Development Program - I am lucky enough to be working with our Assistant Principals as facilitator of the Middle Leadership Development Program (MLDP) over the next 18 months. Late last year, our Assistant Principals went through a highly competitive and rigorous selection process through the School Leadership Institute and were successful in gaining a place in the program. A huge achievement! Yesterday, the program kicked off, with our team engaging in world-class, evidence-informed, and future focused leadership development; the first of its kind for middle leaders in Australia.

The MLDP will build leadership excellence and help lift learning outcomes for students. It is designed around the core principles of moral purpose, inclusion and impact and is underpinned by the notion that middle leaders play a crucial role in leading excellence in teaching practice and impacting student outcomes. Exciting times for BPS!

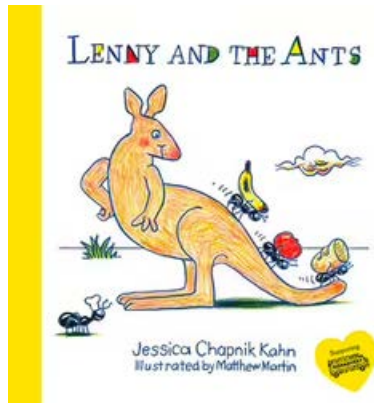


Thinking and Acting Locally and Globally



Lenny and the Ants

Late last term, Year 1 and 2 students were treated to a book reading and discussion led by Rose Bay Secondary College students, Talia and Maya. The story, *Lenny and the Ants*, encouraged students to think about food wastage in a warm-hearted way. Students were then involved in a powerful discussion about whether one person can make a difference, reflected honestly about when they waste food and shared ideas about what they can do to make the world a better place. It was a very special opportunity and we were lucky enough to have the book, complete with recipes, donated to our school library afterwards.



Plastic Free Boy

Last week we were lucky enough to have Arlian the 'Plastic Free Boy' come to visit the school. Arlian talked to us about the harm that plastic has both on us and the environment around us. He also taught us about the ways that we can reduce the amount of plastic that we use on a daily basis to move towards being plastic free. Following his talks to the whole school, he came and had a discussion with the Planeteers to talk about what we can do as a school. The Planeteers came up with some fantastic ideas that will be announced soon.

2TD with Ms Thomas and Ms Darvill

2TD Adventurers have been soaring high already this term.

Students expanded their knowledge and appreciation of Indigenous change-makers and trailblazers through enthusiastic engagement with this year's NAIDOC theme of 'Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!' We heard the story of Patyegarang, researched contemporary Aboriginal figures from Baker Boy to Ash Barty, and even learnt some words in Dharug language.

Our literacy focus this term is persuasive writing. After an inspiring visit from the Plastic Free Boy, we are focusing our skill development around the topic of sustainability. Using the visual prompt of a hamburger to help them structure their texts, students are writing impressive paragraphs full of juicy arguments and strong opening and closing statements to persuade their audience.

Finally, our boogie shoes are getting a workout from Footsteps in preparation for our concert and 2TD are already displaying some seriously smooth moves - it's taking all their teacher's concentration to keep up! We are full of energy and passion for learning in 2TD!

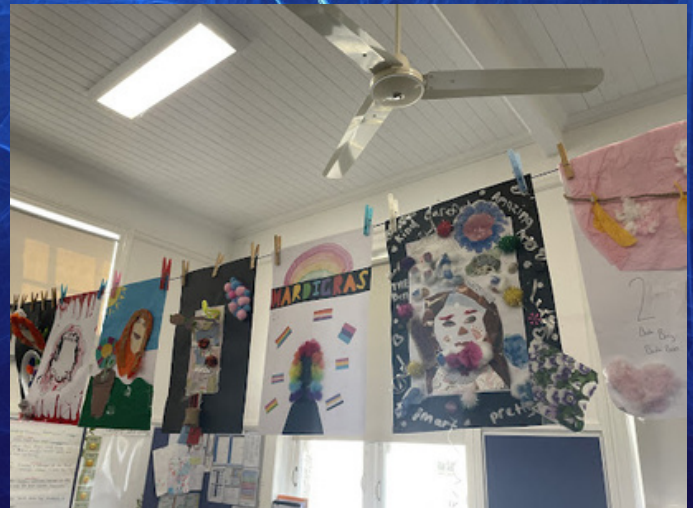


Spotlight on Learning



5/6L with Ms Leckie

5/6L have been working hard in all key learning areas. Our most recent focus in writing and reading has been using 'show don't tell' sentences and choosing vocabulary with stronger meaning, to make our writing more descriptive. We have finished our study on Australia's influential historical figures and their impact during colonial times, and are ready to commence learning about why people migrate to Australia. 5/6L are eager to begin our next project during maths, which encompasses many topics such as length, area, angles, time and more. Watch this space! During art, we have been engaging with a variety of mediums and techniques. At the end of term 2, students particularly enjoyed experimenting with materials and collage techniques to create a mixed media artwork inspired by First Nations artist, Karla Dickens. 5/6L students love getting their hands dirty to maintain our garden, always working together to weed, water and harvest. Check out those giant snow peas! Students are enjoying getting their groove on during Dance Fever and Footsteps, our two dance programs for this term, as a part of our PDHPE and CAPA curriculum areas.

STEAM with Mr Forbes - Part 1



2022 Term Two was TOURNAMENT TIME!

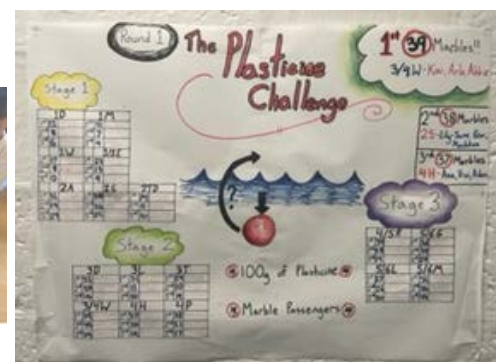
Grades 1-6 embarked upon 4 rounds of competitive science fun, with various design thinking challenges designed to test the mettle of our brave young scientists in training. Always competing in the usual science structure of teams of 3 students, each class abided by the same rules, and had their top 3 best scores and team names recorded up for all to see.



ROUND 1 - The Plasticine Challenge

Plasticine sinks. But how could we make it float??? And if you can figure that out, whose plasticine will be able to carry the most passengers?!

1. Each team had to use scales to measure out PRECISELY 100g of plasticine, to ensure equity in score comparisons. The students then built and shaped their plasticine into a shape they thought may float, with lots of interesting variation in different ideas to be tested
2. The teams were called together to each do the 'weigh-in' to check that they do indeed have exactly the correct weight of plasticine. If passed, the team could test their design idea in front of the watchful eyes of the class to see if it floated or not. If not passed, no testing allowed!
3. Time to add some marbles! Students carefully added marble passengers to their final designs, one at a time, until eventually they sunk!



CONGRATULATIONS WENT TO **KAI, ARLO AND ABBIE** OF 3/4W WHO WON ROUND 1!

They managed to float an amazing 39 marbles!

They were presented the 3 giant marbles as the trophies for Round 1.



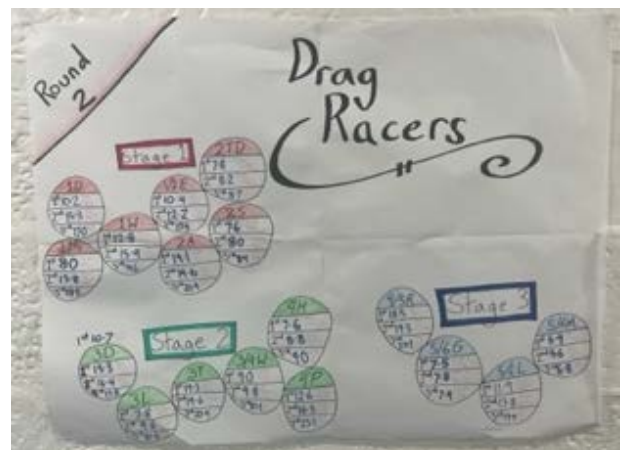
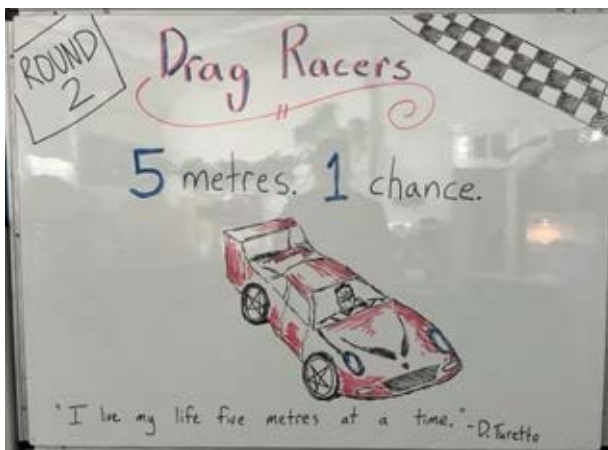

ROUND 2 - Drag Racers

A straight shot 5 metre burn! This challenge was just about raw, pure speed. Using the Lego We-Do robotics kits, the students were challenged to build the fastest possible race car to zoom down a 5 metre race track.

1. First step was all teams built a standard race car using the instructions on the Lego We-Do app. This standard car could do the 5 metres in about 20 seconds.
2. Teams then started making CHANGES to their race cars. Maybe try out bigger wheels? Or different rubber bands? Maybe even trying to create a higher gear arrangement with the wheel and axles?
3. Every change made, was tested and timed on a mini 2m race track, to see if the change INCREASED or DECREASED their speed. Only the best changes stayed on!



CONGRATULATIONS WENT TO **BILL, RAIMI AND TRISTAN** OF 5/6M WHO WON ROUND 2! They managed to get the absolute fastest race time with a blistering 5.4 seconds! They were presented with the 3 red Ferraris as the trophies for Round 2.

Plastic free boy

On Wednesday we had the pleasure of having Arlian (aka plastic free boy) to give us some tips on ways to be sustainable at school and at home. We looked at some videos and news reports about his journey to going plastic free and encouraging others to do as well. Over the past 4 years he has visited over 100 schools in Sydney and Port Douglas speaking about sustainability and the do's and don'ts of the environment.

A bit about you.....

I was born and raised in Japan and I studied landscape architecture at University. I worked as a park ranger at the wetland reserve and became a specialist for habitat management of shore birds. I've been living in Bondi for 20 years and I have a son in year 4 at Bondi Beach public school. I previously worked in a lovely child care centre in Bondi as a chef where I introduced healthy and sustainable food to the children. My passion is always working with children and nature within the community, so working in the BPS canteen is my new mission and I truly enjoy being in this community.

What inspired your passion?

When I first started working in the canteen, I was overwhelmed by the amount of disposable packaging we use each day. I was also surprised that there were bins full of half eaten sandwiches and other dishes. It was extremely heartbreaking so I took the opportunity to make the school a better place.

What are your plans to make the school sustainable?

Start from the school canteen. We are currently working towards minimizing the use of single use plastic food packaging. I would love to see our canteen being single use plastic free in the future.

What are some ways we can be sustainable at home?

- Compost your food scraps
- Collect soft plastics and recycle them at Woolworths and Coles using their recycle program
- No packaging in lunchboxes and try to have a nude lunch! Muesli bars, yogurt pouches, packets of crackers or chips, and the wrapping of sandwiches are all bad examples of things to put in your lunchbox because they all have single use packaging
- Buy second hand (or trade in) whenever possible e.g clothes, books, toys games
- Say no to straws (even if it's paper), lids for take away drinks and a carry bag
- Dine in whenever possible instead of takeaway to avoid all packaging.

Step 1 - Open Internet Browser

Step 2 - In Address Bar - Type in 'NSW Premier's Reading Challenge or type <https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html> into your browser page and press enter

Step 3 - Click 'Log in'

Step 4 - Enter your Student User ID and Password.

Your name will appear on the top right hand side of the screen as shown, once logged in.

Step 5 - Click on the Blue Banner - 'Visit the PRC Student Site!'

Step 6 - Use the Yellow Banner - Discover books to read to search for titles either by year level or by Genre, or, click on the Blue Banner to search books by Title, Author, ISBN or Premier's Reading Challenge ID (PRC ID - then click add to reading log.

Remember to read the rules for your year level to ensure that the books you are reading will count towards the challenge.
