#### **Deputy's Delivery**

#### **Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)**

Each year all government and non-government schools in Australia are required to participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (the NCCD). The information collected by the NCCD helps teachers, principals, education authorities and governments to better support students with disabilities at school. Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students is an essential part of the NCCD. #### **Student Led Conferences (SLCs)**

Thank you for your participation in last week's Student Led Conferences. It was the first time we have run SLCs at Bondi Public school and I am grateful for the way our staff and students were able to execute the event with high levels of organisation and authentic presentation of student learning.

We are in the process of collecting and collating feedback from staff and students, but can report that parent/carer feedback was overwhelmingly positive. Of the 153 respondents, 93% found the SLCs a valuable addition and felt they were well-organised. 90% reported that their children were able to guide discussion around their learning and 94% said that they would like to see the SLCs continue at BPS, moving forward. In the written responses, two of the positive responses that shone through repeatedly





were; the visible pride students had in their work and their school, and parents/carers being able to engage positively with their children around learning. Moving forward, we will look at the possibility of increasing the booking times, including student/parent school tours and perhaps the introduction of an "SLC Sausage Sizzle" - it seems some were a little peckish!

Thank you for your extremely encouraging and constructive feedback. This will help guide us for next year's SLCs.

Children explained how they used mixed media art to create magical castles. First, students used a lead pencil to draw the outline of their castle. Then, they coloured their castle using oil pastels. Next, they painted the grass and the sky using watercolour paint. Finally, they placed glue onto selected parts of the castle and sprinkled glitter on top to make it sparkle.

During Student-Led Conferences, KJ children also showed their guests the massive improvement in their writing skills, comparing the start of the year to now. The difference is amazing!


#### 4/5R with Mr O'Keefe

4/5R have been working hard across all key learning areas and are having a blast this term!

The class enjoyed creating artwork based on our class novel 'Wonder' by R. J. Palacio. The students wrote positive character traits about themselves and use watercolour to create their masterpiece.

During reading, we have been learning about visual literacy and our ability to make meaning from visual texts. Inspired by the book, 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan, students identified literary techniques and annotated their page to share with the class.
