

## **Spotlight on Learning**

### **3T with Ms Thomson**

The 3T dream team has been diving in across all of our Key Learning Areas and has had a wonderful and exciting start to the year. Our literacy focus has been exploring the theme of "community and home to many", in which the students created hands with their own cultural backgrounds and influences to demonstrate Australia's multicultural history.

We have been hard at work writing "persuasions", with fun topics such as 'Homework Should Be Banned" and "Saving the Oceans". We have been focusing on our skill development of using different techniques such as high modality, as well as persuasive devices such as repetition, exaggeration, alliteration and emotional language that authors use to engage and persuade the reader.

In maths, one of our focus areas has been 2D space. We have been learning about special quadrilaterals, tessellation, transitions, parallel lines and symmetry, in which the students were able to explore tessellation with 2

D shapes and the idea of symmetry in their butterfly artworks.

We also had a really awesome day dressing up as teachers, and you'll probably agree with me that Freddy nailed it being Ms T for the day.

### **Spotlight on Learning**

### **KD** with Miss Devenish

Wow! What a fantastic start to school KD has had! It has been an eventful first few weeks, filled with learning, new routines, and some wonderful memories already.

A highlight of this time has been KD's first garden lessons, where students enjoyed watering plants, searching for ripe tomatoes, and admiring the small creatures (such as ladybugs!) which live among the plants. Each class member showed patience, teamwork, and curiosity, demonstrated through their questions, ideas, and care for the natural space.

Students were introduced to the schools 'Grow Your Mind' program, as they met the 5 animal characters which help us understand different feelings and parts of our brain. During these lessons, KD spoke about how different times might require different animals to 'wake up', and how we can calm down other animals when big feelings arise. We have been using 'anchor breathing' to practise connecting with feelings, and calming our minds.

KD has participated in a range of literacy and numeracy activities during the first few weeks. They have practised ordinal numbers by joining in on a "KD race day" where the class labelled winners *first, second, and third.* Students have also used fine motor skills during maths rotations. Some favourite activities include 'number beading', practising number formation in 'magic rice', and counting using 10 frames!

During phonics/phonemic awareness lessons, KD has been learning to identify sounds, recognise letters and match them to their sounds. Students have begun to segment and decode words to support their reading and writing. It has also been wonderful to see KD students gaining confidence, and applying these skills when reading in small groups.

## Stage 3 Camp

Students from Stage 3 ventured to Canberra during Week 5 on an educational tour of the nation's capital. They had the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy as well as enhance their social and personal skills.

During the camp, our students visited various historical and political sites such as the Australian War Memorial, Parliament House, Old Parliament House (Museum of Australian Democracy), the National Gallery of Australia and of course Questacon, just to name a few. They had the opportunity to participate in various educational activities such as workshops and guided tours, which gave them a firsthand experience of the Australian government and its institutions.

Apart from the educational aspect, the camp was a fantastic opportunity for our students to develop their social and personal skills. They stayed in cabins with their classmates, shared meals, and participated in team-building activities at some of the locations we visited like the Arboretum. These activities taught them valuable skills such as communication, leadership, and problem-solving.

The camp was an enriching and rewarding experience for our students and enhanced their understanding of the world around them. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as a part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$ 30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate was paid directly to the school and was discounted from the price of the excursion.

Thank you to the Stage 3 team and supporting teachers, Miss Pattison, Ms O'Connor and Miss Perez for all your planning and preparation leading up to the camp as well as the support you gave our students whilst away on camp.

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### **Grow Your Mind**

#### Introducing Grow Your Mind:

Our school has started using a program that promotes whole school flourishing called Grow Your Mind. During our first session we explored all the ways we look after our physical health daily. Brushing our teeth, eating fruit and vegetables, drinking water etc. Then we explored how we look after our minds on a daily basis. This was harder to do initially! Children were then asked to point to their toes, their heart, their prefrontal cortex...! And so the journey has begun of brain awareness. Listen out for your child talking about shrinking their Guard Dog, or growing their Wise Owl, their Elephant and their Sifting Sooty.

Grow Your Mind mental health tip #1:

To shrink your Guard Dog (aka your amygdala):

- 1. Take 3 anchor breaths
- 2. Try finger breathing
- 3. Think of one thing or person you are thankful for



3. Gratitude journal to protect my mind ....?

Gratitude what? It doesn't have to be a journal. Just spending 1 minute a day thinking of the good things you have in your life is enough to start building up your resilience for whatever life throws you. So how do you grow gratitude? Tips: 1. Start a class gratitude jar 2. Keep a gratitude journal at home 3. Try mindful eating, savouring each mouthful and appreciating where it has come from 4. Start thanking the people who treat you well Why?

Scientists have studied what makes people happy and what makes them bounce back after hard times. The common theme: gratitude. Which as we discussed in all of our classes this week, is a fancy word for being thankful.

### We are excited to announce our school will be transitioning to an upgraded School Bytes finance system on 21 March 2023!

In preparation for the transition to a simplified finance system for both you and the school, we will be required to implement a short payment lockout period where we will not be able to receive any online or EFTPOS payments.

#### What this means for you

- No payments can be made online or via EFTPOS from 4pm, Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2023 to 6am on Tuesday, 21<sup>st</sup> March 2023.
- Any existing payment links that have been sent to you previously in emails can still be used after the transition and will automatically redirect to the new system
- After the transition, a School Bytes portal will be available for you to register and begin using (Link: <u>https://portal.schoolbytes.education</u>)
- All previous payments made will be migrated to the new School Bytes finance system and portal

#### What is the School Bytes portal

The School Bytes portal provides flexibility for you to conveniently:

- Make school payments online (including paying for multiple siblings at once)
- · Use a family credit to pay for an activity or school contributions
- Download a receipt for payments made
- View all historical payments in one place
- Complete and submit digital permission notes
- View the status of all permission notes
- Request a refund if required

This can be done where you want at any time: day or night.

Through the portal, you will easily be able to download a receipt once a payment has been made and have access to view all historical payments when needed. Online payments are processed in real-time and can be viewed by school staff immediately.

While our preference is for payments to be made via the portal, we will still accept payment via cash, cheque, money order and EFTPOS.

#### CHESS!!


Learn to be a chess champion! Coaching for students at Bondi Public School is held on Mondays from 1:15pm to 2:00pm, starting on 6 February 2023.


