Dear parents and carers,

I'm pleased to be able to share my P&C report with you. Thanks to everyone who was able to attend in person and make connections with one another.

NAPLAN

We have been working with our Director of Educational Leadership, Dr Paul Owens, to analyse our summary data, form a context specific report and pinpoint areas for improvement, moving forward. This process has informed adjustments we need to make to our 2021-2025 School Plan. Remember that NAPLAN data is one piece of the overall puzzle and not a true indicator of overall student achievement. We use a range of data sources to plan targeted teaching of literacy and numeracy. If parents/carers have any questions specifically around their child's 2022 NAPLAN results, they are encouraged to make an appointment to discuss with their child's class teacher.

Miss Karen Albronda, our Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction has been working alongside Assistant Principals and teachers to improve student learning outcomes in Mathematics. She presented an overview of 2022 NAPLAN results and the focused work she has been doing to drive improvement.

NSW Curriculum Reform update/Reporting update

The NSW school curriculum has undergone the first comprehensive reform in 30 years after an extensive curriculum review and consultation. Teachers have been implementing the new K-2 English and Mathematics curriculum. As such, student reports will be updated to reflect new Department guidelines.

Extra curricular update

We are so fortunate to have this wonderful opportunity for our students. Creative Arts lessons have been running very smoothly with Miss Pattison and she has enjoyed getting to know our Bondi context and bringing her passion for the Creative Arts to our school. This semester Drama is being taught and next semester students will be learning

Staffing Update

We have re advertised for a Kitchen Specialist and the advertisement closes on 24th March 2023.

We have also advertised for an additional School Learning Support Officer (SLSO) to support our students with additional needs. We have been provided with funding to continue our COVID Learning and Support intervention which we put towards running our Mini/Maq-lit programs, which are evidence-informed literacy intervention programs. Our Learning and Support staff will also be trained in Quick Smart, which is an evidence informed numeracy intervention program designed to assist students to become automatic (quick) in their basic skills in order to move onto more complex problem-solving skills (smart).

We are also seeking Expression Of Interests for a classroom teacher for 3T, while Miss Thompson takes personal leave from term 2 until the end of the year due to family commitments.

Uniform Requirements

Thanks to our community for the support in adopting the new sports shirts and other uniform items that have been added or altered. Our uniform is beginning to look much more consistent across the school; however, further improvement is required.

So that students, staff and the wider community are aware of what is expected of them in terms of uniform, we have drafted a Uniform Requirements (Dress Code) document. This document was drafted after viewing and considering similar documents from other local schools in the Bondi Network.

We are asked those present at the P & C meeting to record any feedback on this document and hand it back at the end of the meeting. The second page of the document will list and show visuals of Summer and Winter uniform requirements.





Canteen Update:

As many of you would have found, FlexiSchools had an outage on March 10th which has now been fixed.

- If you emailed or called through an order on the day that has not been paid for, could you please pay via the IOU section of the app:
- Friday mornings are the busiest time for FlexiSchools all over the country. We highly recommend ordering Thursday night to avoid any potential issues
- Kai is not contactable on her personal mobile phone during the school day if you need to contact the canteen urgently, you must go via the office or come to the canteen in person.



As a reminder, canteen orders close for the day at 8.45am. We recommend getting orders in as early as possible so that you don't accidentally miss the cutoff. As of Term 2, we will only be able to offer a reduced menu if you miss the 8:45am cutoff. We are excited to announce our school will be transitioning to an upgraded School Bytes finance system on 21 March 2023!

In preparation for the transition to a simplified finance system for both you and the school, we will be required to implement a short payment lockout period where we will not be able to receive any online or EFTPOS payments.

What this means for you

- No payments can be made online or via EFTPOS from 4pm, Wednesday 15th March 2023 to 6am on Tuesday, 21st March 2023.
- Any existing payment links that have been sent to you previously in emails can still be used after the transition and will automatically redirect to the new system
- After the transition, a School Bytes portal will be available for you to register and begin using (Link: https://portal.schoolbytes.education)
- All previous payments made will be migrated to the new School Bytes finance system and portal

What is the School Bytes portal

The School Bytes portal provides flexibility for you to conveniently:

- · Make school payments online (including paying for multiple siblings at once)
- . Use a family credit to pay for an activity or school contributions
- Download a receipt for payments made
- View all historical payments in one place
- Complete and submit digital permission notes
- View the status of all permission notes
- · Request a refund if required

This can be done where you want at any time: day or night.




While our preference is for payments to be made via the portal, we will still accept payment via cash, cheque, money order and EFTPOS.




