Dear parents and carers,

While the community continues to live with COVID-19, NSW Health has advised that the unpredictable nature of the virus will continue to present a health risk to the community, especially during the winter months while other respiratory illness' circulate. As a response, our school will continue to operate with our baseline COVID-smart measures in place throughout this term to minimise transmission while prioritising student and staff well-being. These include a combination of layered safety measures such as:

- Staying home if unwell and test for COVID-19 if showing any <u>symptoms External link</u>. Students and staff are advised to stay home until they are well, even if they have a negative COVID-19 test result.
- Boosted day cleaning of high-touch areas in our school
- Well-ventilated learning spaces

Our school may be directed to temporarily reintroduce additional COVID-19 measures, including mandatory mask-wearing and postponing events and gatherings, or directing a cohort to learn from home for a short period to minimise transmission risks. The NSW Department of Education's COVID-19 Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing team will continue to lead this work when it is needed.

I would also like to take this opportunity to share Fire and Rescue NSW's <u>Winter fire safety</u> <u>checklist (PDF 864.8KB)</u>. Please download the checklist and follow the instructions listed to help keep our households safe and warm during the colder months.

On behalf of our school, I want to thank you for your support in helping to keep our students, staff and community safe.

Finally, I wanted to let you know that I have been asked to relieve as Director Educational Leadership in Week 10 of this term and Week 1 next term. We are fortunate to have a talented and dedicated executive team who will relieve in higher duties during this time. Miss Anna O'Connor will relieve as Principal in Week 10 and Mr Michal Maslanka will relieve as Deputy Principal. In Week 1 Mr Maslanka will relieve as Principal (while Miss O'Connor is on leave) and Mr Anthony White will relieve as Deputy Principal.

Attendance

Please remember that full time attendance at school is not only imperative for your child's learning and wellbeing, it is a legal requirement in Australia. We want to ensure your child's learning is maximised and that they are well connected to their peers and teachers. This can only happen if they are at school every day. The only exception to this is genuine illness or extraordinary family circumstances. Here are a couple of things that are important for every family to remember:

- Please ensure your child is at school every day. If they are sick or you have extraordinary circumstances, it is essential that you explain this absence to the school. This is best done via email.
- Partial absences can disrupt your child's learning and have a significant impact.
 Arriving late in the morning or leaving early in the afternoon without a genuine reason is a concern and will have an impact on your child. Please make sure your child is at school on time every day and stays until 3.00pm.
- Remember that planned travel should be taken during school holidays and not during the school term. Applications for extended leave for holidays outside of school time will usually not be approved if a student's attendance is below the legislated requirement of 85%.
- Appointments with allied health care providers (e.g. speech therapists, occupational therapists, psychologists) should be scheduled outside of school hours to minimise disruption.

Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up. Every day matters and we are here to support all students in attending and engaging with their learning, on time, every day of the term. Thank you for your support with this.

Spotlight on a Class

KV with Ms Vidler

Students in KV continue to grow in all aspects of their learning, both in and outside the classroom.

Recently in writing, we explored character traits within texts such as 'When Billy was a dog' by Kirsty Murray. Learning about sentence structure, nouns and verbs and using our skills of sounding out, KV students completed sentences on what they would do if they were a dog. As you can imagine this led to a very funny discussion!

In mathematics, students have been learning strategies to add and subtract numbers and have been doing a great job during group rotations.

Garden with Miss Nelly continues to be a fortnightly highlight for all of us. Students showed care and teamwork during their recent lesson by digging for worms and observing how long it took for the worms to wriggle into the soil.

KV has been learning about gratitude, including what it means, what it looks like, and how to practise it. We have been using a gratitude hand exercise where we reflect on five things we are grateful for. As a class, we understand that this exercise helps us to develop a more positive outlook and become more appreciative of the things we have.

Almost halfway through Kindergarten and we are so proud of the achievements we have made so far. Continuing to be safe, respectful, learners, we are excited to see what the rest of the year holds.








Spotlight on a Class

2H with Ms Hill



descriptions from two very different quality texts: 'The boy who

tried to shrink his name' by Sandhya Parappukkaran and 'Hark, It's Me, Ruby Lee!' by Lisa Shanahan. We challenged ourselves to

create clever similes that had never been used before and use thrilling noun groups to build descriptions of people and things.

We also learnt to use background knowledge to make an inference

and compared and contrasted characters in texts. We created our very own character descriptions using action and sensing verbs and students were challenged to add adverbs to their writing. We co-constructed writing success criteria as a class and then pretended we were detectives to ensure each other's writing ticked all the boxes. To help get into the mind of a character we played 'hot seat' and thought up interesting questions for those students impersonating a character from the book.

In maths we have been using our knowledge of place value to partition large numbers. We have also learnt to count and represent large sets of objects by systematically grouping in tens and hundreds using base 10 blocks. We have sequenced numbers and arranged them on a line by considering the order and size of those numbers.

2H has been finding ways to show respect in the classroom by demonstrating active listening, sharing, turn taking and communicating appropriately. We have also been participating in a weekly game of 'Secret act of kindness', where we pull a name out of a hat and have 24 hours to complete an act. At the end, students have an opportunity to guess who it was, and the kindness-givers are revealed!

Congratulations to Hugo (3/4W), Clara (3/4W) and Teiki (5/6C) for their outstanding effort in presenting prepared and impromptu speeches in the Local Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition held at Bellevue Hill Public School on Tuesday. Clara was awarded the Highly Commended Speaker for the Stage Two competition. Well done!

We will be putting on a BBQ for our volunteers! If you're able to help, please sign up today!


