2025 Planning and Class Formations

Thank you to all of our families for completing the survey around intentions for 2025 - this is greatly assisting us in our planning.

We have had some requests regarding class placements for next year, so we wanted to take this opportunity to explain how classes are formed. While we understand the importance of friendships and particular class requests, accommodating all family requests is, unfortunately, logistically impossible. We respectfully ask that our families refrain from sending through requests for friends and/or teachers.

When forming classes, we apply our professional judgement to ensure fairness and equity for *all* students, carefully creating groups that foster positive social and learning dynamics. For 2025, class formations will take into account factors such as student numbers, gender, age, social-emotional and learning needs, as well as any other identified additional needs. Over many years, we've seen that students thrive when encouraged to form new friendships, and they will be supported in building these connections. They will also have regular opportunities to engage with students from other classes, which enriches their social experience.

It's important to note that we cannot guarantee students will be placed with particular friends. However, later in the term, teachers will invite students to identify a few "positive learning buddies." This will help us to ensure they are in a class with at least one of their chosen "learning buddies" next year.

If you feel your child needs special consideration due to diagnosed additional needs or significant mental health challenges, please reach out to your child's class teacher or Stage Assistant Principal to discuss further.

Bondi Public School Student Dress Code

est. 2023 in consultation with key stakeholders

Rationale:

The NSW Department of Education requires that schools set local school uniform requirements. The Department supports the wearing of school uniform, which promotes a sense of belonging for students and creates a positive identity for the school community. School uniforms also contribute to the personal safety of students by allowing easier recognition of students inside the school and in the community. Schools expect students to wear the uniform during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when engaged in school activities out of school hours.

Aims:

- To promote participation, equity and inclusion amongst all students
- To offer choice and support gender diversity
- To further develop students' sense of belonging through building pride in, and identification with our school.
- To offer durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment.
- To maintain and enhance the positive image of the school in the community.

Implementation:

After consultation with the school staff, the P & C and the Student Representative Council, the school is proud to implement a Dress Code that promotes consistency, provides choice for the students, allows for students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, and caters for the financial constraints of families. School uniform items have been carefully selected by the uniform committee following consultation periods with all stakeholders in the school community over a number of years.

- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.
- Summer and Winter uniforms, as well as sports uniforms are prescribed, and are required to be worn.
- During Terms 1 & 4, Summer uniforms are worn. During Terms 2 and 3, Winter uniforms are worn.
- Year 6 polo shirts can be worn on non-sports days as part of leadership incentive and pride.
- Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, plus watches (not SMART watches) are the only acceptable jewellery for safety reasons.
- The BPS sports uniform is also the school's excursion uniform and must be worn when leaving the school
 for the day.
- Hair ties, ribbons, headbands etc. are to be black or white, or teal for sports days.
- The only headwear that is acceptable is our sunsmart BPS hat. Hats must be worn outside during recess, lunch, sport and any other outside activity including excursions.
- The P&C operates the school <u>Uniform Shop</u> and also operates a second hand uniform pool for parents.
- The BPS Dress Code will be published in the newsletter each term.
- Parents seeking exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious beliefs, ethnic or cultural background, student disability, or health conditions must apply in writing to the principal.
- Financial support and a clothing pool is available for families who require financial support. Families should seek support from the principal.
- Students not wearing full school uniform may be issued with a notification that will need to be acknowledged by parents/carers.

The entire school community is responsible for the implementation of this Dress Code.



I, Mr G, am thrilled to share that 5/6G has kicked off Term 4 with remarkable enthusiasm and dedication! The students have shown incredible motivation, setting a positive tone for the weeks ahead. It is wonderful to see such excellent work come through in the final term of the school year and the final term at primary school for our wonderful Year 6 cohort.

One of the standout achievements this term has been the students' exceptional work in writing. They have embraced the art of letter writing and blogging, showcasing their creativity and individuality. Each student has crafted thoughtful letters and engaging blog posts from the point of view of the characters in the novel 'August and Jones' written by Pip Harry. It is awesome to see the students not only connect with the text on such a deep level but also connect with their audience through a variety of styles and perspectives.



In art, the class has been busy studying the iconic works of Jackson Pollock and Piet Mondrian. The students have not only learned about these influential artists but have also channelled their inspiration to recreate some of their famous styles. From the dynamic splashes of colour reminiscent of Pollock's action painting to the bold lines and primary colours characteristic of Mondrian, 5/6G has truly excelled in bringing these masterpieces to life.

Finally, it has been amazing that 5/6G have had the opportunity to embrace the local surroundings in Term 4 by making their way down to the beach each Wednesday for our weekly surf lessons with 'Let's Go Surfing Bondi'! The students have shown exceptional motivation and resilience, carving up the waves in style. Students are separated into two groups where they enjoy learning to surf the swell and doing fun competitive activities on boogie boards.

As we continue this term, Mr. G. couldn't be prouder of the progress and achievements of 5/6G. Keep up the fantastic work, everyone!







1R with Miss Katie Richards

It's been an exciting start to Term 4 in our classroom, and we're thrilled to share what we've been up to. From learning new skills in mathematics to unleashing our creativity through art and writing, students have been busy exploring, growing, and building friendships. Read on to catch up on all our highlights!

A big focus in our classroom this term has been setting daily goals and growing as individuals. In 1R, we believe that learning isn't just about reading and numbers—it's also about developing strong character traits to help us become kind, thoughtful, respectful, and resilient people. Each morning during circle time, students select a character strength they want to grow for the day or week. We discuss what that character strength means, why they're focusing on it, what it looks like in action, and how they can practice it throughout their day. Whether it's showing patience while waiting their turn or demonstrating courage by trying something new, our students are learning that building character is just as important as mastering academic skills.

In writing, our young authors have been mastering how to write an OREO paragraph, where they present an Opinion, Reason, Example, and restate their Opinion. We tied this technique to an important topic: protecting our oceans, inspired by two amazing books, The Mess That We Made by Michelle Lord and Jelly Boy by Nicole Goodwin. After learning eye-opening facts about pollution and its impact on marine life, students eagerly shared their opinions on why it's essential to keep our oceans clean. For example, after discovering that plastic bags can harm turtles, many students wrote persuasive OREO paragraphs about banning plastic bags. They stated their opinions, provided reasons (like how sea turtles can mistake plastic for jellyfish), gave examples of the harm caused, and concluded by restating their stance with confidence. It's been wonderful to see them using their new writing skills to express such thoughtful and passionate ideas about protecting our planet!









In Mathematics, 1R students are getting hands-on with two important skills: telling the time and rounding numbers. Learning to read an analog clock is a valuable skill! We've been focusing on "o'clock" and "half-past," understanding the minutes and hours. It's a skill that not only helps 1R keep track of their day but is also fun and interactive. Alongside mastering time-telling, we've been practicing rounding numbers to the nearest ten and hundred. To help us decide which way to round, we have a special rhyme: "5-9 climb the vine, 0-4 slide to the floor." If you ask any student in 1R, they'll be able to recite it and help you round!

Beyond the classroom, we had some very exciting visitors on Monday. What a special afternoon we had in 1R! We listened to our grandparents and VIPs share stories from their school days, learned what life was like for them compared to now, and proudly showed off our reading skills. It was an afternoon full of smiles and excitement, with games and laughter shared between generations!





Positive Behaviour for Learning

Welcome to our newsletter, Wellie!

We are excited to keep you informed about the latest happenings at our school around our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) framework!

Here is just a little bit about PBL - it is a framework that creates safe and orderly learning environments in schools, while improving the social-emotional outcomes for students. It involves developing clear behavioural expectations, explicit teaching, acknowledging appropriate behaviour, consistently correcting inappropriate actions, and using behavioural data to address issues. These strategies create a supportive environment for student success!

Every two weeks, the entire school focuses on a targeted positive behaviour in response to student needs across the school. This systematic teaching helps students understand what is expected of them. These lessons are informed by our behaviour data and cover topics like eating time or smooth transitions. Classes explore what these behaviours look like through the lens of our school values; being Safe, Respectful Learners. The lessons are tailored to suit the age and needs of each class. In the alternate PBL weeks, we focus on character strengths from our Grow Your Mind program, such as empathy and honesty.

Here's a quote we value, and we'll leave it with you until we meet again in Week 6!

If a child doesn't know how to read, we teach.






