Spotlight on Learning

3R with Mr Nathan Rowe

This term in 3R, we've explored exciting topics across all subjects! In visual arts, students created optical illusions inspired by M.C. Escher, using line, shape, and shading to produce striking 'Op Art.' This complemented our mathematics unit on 3D objects, where students identified prisms and pyramids through hands-on activities and discovered how different shapes form incredible illusions. They also worked on addition and subtraction algorithms and solved money problems involving change.

In geography, we've focused on sustainability, researching how people and communities worldwide care for the environment. Using Canva, students presented their findings on leading sustainable countries, highlighting their research and digital skills. In literacy, students have planned, drafted, and published narrative stories using picture prompts. By following the 'narrative mountain', they developed detailed characters and settings, incorporating figurative language, descriptive adjectives, and dialogue to bring their ideas to life.

Many students have shown outstanding effort and commitment throughout the year, earning their well-deserved Gold Awards—a wonderful way to celebrate their hard work and achievements!













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Spotlight on Learning

2M with Mr Mitchell Suey

This term in 2M, we have been working hard in and out of the classroom. In Personal Development and Health (PDH) we have focused on how each of us can be a person of benefit. This has inspired students to be thinking about how we can build others up that are around us. During the session, students took a moment to share a time in 2M when someone had "filled their bucket" by showing kindness. It was wonderful to see so many beautiful examples of generosity and compassion to reflect on and feel proud of.

In Literacy, 2M has been focusing on writing persuasive texts about the importance of trees. The students have been using the OREO structure (Opinion, Reason, Explanation, Opinion Restated/Call to Action) to help organise their ideas clearly and effectively. To ensure our arguments were compelling, we added specialised vocabulary, high-modality words, and rhetorical questions. The students worked hard to create persuasive texts that not only showcased their writing skills but also emphasised the critical role trees play.

KO with Mr Eoghan O'Muirgheasa

What a busy few weeks we have been having in KO! With gymnastics, kitchen, garden, our excursion to the Botanical Gardens and all the learning we have been doing in class, the children have been making great progress and having lots of fun along the way

During our English lessons, we have been working on creating compound sentences, using adjectives and writing interesting stories. This week we have been using the story 'Koala Lou' by Mem Fox and 'Nannie Loves' by Kylie Dunstan to inspire our writing. The children have loved writing their compound sentences and reading them out to the class.

During our mathematic lessons, we have been learning different strategies for addition and subtraction. We have used our 'Friends of 10' strategy, concrete materials and number lines too. The children have been collecting and representing data and answering questions based on the graphs. We loved tallying our favourite smoothie during our kitchen session. We have also been investigating 2D shapes. We were naming them, making them and using them to create pictures with some interesting results.

Seasons for Growth and Aussie Optimism

We have had a wonderful year, successfully completing 2 rounds of both the 'Seasons for Growth' wellbeing program and 'Aussie Optimism' social life skills program at BPS.

Some Early Stage 1 students participated in the 'Seasons for Growth' program this term and last term and learnt about change, loss and how to process emotions. When asked what they liked about the program the

- "To be sad when I needed to be."

Year 2 Swimming Scheme

During Weeks 3 and 4, Year 2 participated in the NSW DoE Swimming Scheme at Botany Aquatic Centre. The NSW Department of Education School Swimming Scheme is an intensive learn to swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. The scheme is conducted over ten days. Each daily lesson is 45 minutes.

Students were placed in different groups to focus on a range of targeted survival and swimming skills. They were taught the correct form and movement for the strokes they were learning or refining over the two week period. To wrap up each session, students engaged in fun, interactive games that not only reinforced their skills but also kept the atmosphere lively and enjoyable, leaving them with big smiles on their faces! NSW Sustainability Awards 2024 Minister's Young Climate Champion

Dallas and Bondi Public School have been selected as finalists in the NSW Minister's Young Climate Champion Awards, which took place last Friday evening at the Australian National Maritime Museum.

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The Minister's Young Climate Champion Award recognises young innovators aged under 18 years who bring bold ideas for a safe and thriving climate future. Young and passionate minds who have taken outstanding actions that benefit the sustainability of their communities and help address climate change were showcased in this award, celebrating young people with drive, commitment and a passion for sustainability and the environment.

Dallas was nominated for his 'Sea, Snap, Save' App which is now used by the NSW Department of Primary Industries 'Fish Smart' App to report sightings of the critically endangered Grey Nurse Shark and up to 40 other endangered marine species.

Waverley Council Youth summit

Three of Bondi Public School's school captains; Wren, Lilly and Atticus had the privilege of representing our school at the Waverley Youth Summit on Friday, 15th November.

The students got to meet and work with Joshua Spicer and Nicole Fairley, who stated that it was an honour to meet and speak to such thoughtful, focused, and inspiring young people.

The summit was attended by 33 students from 8 local primary and secondary schools. Our students explored and gave opinions on the priority issues identified by the Waverley Community. They collaborated with peers from the other schools on developing clear actions to address these issues. We heard that it is important for our community's wellbeing that we have:

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Positive Behaviour for Learning

Wellie, you're back!


At BPS, every classroom has the **Positive Behaviour for Learning Response Chart** (seen below) to help students understand and follow our expectations for behaviour. This chart highlights the importance of rewarding positive actions and provides clear steps for improving behaviour when needed.



Why is it important?

- **Clear expectations**: Students know exactly what is expected of them.
- **Positive reinforcement**: Good behaviour is recognised and celebrated.
- **Consistency**: All students are held to the same high standards no matter who is teaching them.
- **Growth mindset**: Encourages students to keep improving, even when things don't go perfectly.

Please note that the PBL strategies are tailored to fit the needs of each class/individual student. For instance, Kindergarten students are primarily encouraged with verbal praise, while older students may use individual behaviour charts on their desks to help them stay accountable and develop independence (see below).



By using the PBL Behaviour Chart, we're creating a positive, focused, and respectful school environment where all students can thrive. Thank you for supporting this initiative at home!




