#### An Astonishing Achievement

Our school counsellor, Monica Pinkus recently attended a special ceremony in recognition of her 50 years of service to Public Education, with a celebratory service recognition dinner hosted by the Premier, Chris Minns. We are in awe of Monica's contribution and are grateful for her immense

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In recognition of Monica's extraordinary 50 year career in Public Education, beginning with her work as a classroom teacher at Matraville High School to making the decision to retrain as a school counsellor in the early 1980s. After an initial retirement in her 50s, Monica decided to return to public education driven by a deep commitment to students and a sense of duty during a time of counsellor shortages.

As a mother and grandmother, Monica brings deep empathy and understanding to her work. Each week she commutes from the Central Coast to Sydney to support students and families at Fort Street, Bondi & Ettalong Public Schools. Her dedication, compassion and deep commitment have impacted many lives and stands as a testament to her enduring passion for education and the power of providing little moments of lasting change.

With heartfelt gratitude we honour Monica's contribution to many generations of students and to a life of public service.

#### **Communication is Key**

A friendly reminder that our newsletters are designed to provide updates and information around teaching, learning, wellbeing and community events - often retrospectively.

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#### Starting Strong in 2025...

Whilst meticulous plans have been made, the school will need to wait for all current students to return and for new enrolments arriving in 2025 to be processed before finalising classes and teacher placements. This is common practice in schools and it ensures that accurate student



numbers are accounted for, which is essential for creating balanced class sizes, allocating teachers effectively and avoiding unnecessary changes down the track. By waiting for this information, the school can better meet the needs of all students, provide appropriate staffing, and maintain a smooth start to the school year. This process requires patience and flexibility from families and staff, as the school works to accommodate any arising changes and ensure the best possible learning environment for every child.

#### Location, Location, Location!

To best accommodate our classes and maximise student learning time, most cohorts will be in different areas of the school in 2025, with the exception of Stage 3. We are also looking to work with the community to create some specialised spaces such as a Creative Arts room. New class areas will be communicated early in the new year via School Bytes.

#### **Class Formations (Repeat Item - T4, Wk3 Newsletter)**

When forming classes, school staff apply professional judgement to ensure fairness and equity for *all* students, carefully creating groups that foster positive social and learning dynamics. For 2025, class formations will take into account factors such as student numbers, gender, age, social-emotional and learning needs, as well as any other identified additional needs. Over many years, schools have seen that students thrive when encouraged to form new friendships, and they will be supported in building these connections. They will also have regular opportunities to engage with students from other classes, which enriches their social experience. ## Curriculum Crunch Assistant Principal, Curricululm & Instruction

It is that glorious time of year again where the cicadas are singing and students happily return from their break times with red, rosie cheeks and little beads of sweat that sit on their nose and glisten like miniature Christmas baubles. For teachers, the daily run for an iced coffee or two is imminent as they make their way slowly but surely to the finish line. But most importantly, it is a time to reflect and celebrate a year's worth of growth, learning and achievements.

In my role as Assistant Principal of Curriculum and Instruction, the last couple of years has been dedicated to working with teachers to enhance our reading and numeracy teaching and learning programs. So with that in mind, here is a list of some of the students growth, learning and achievements from 2024 that are definitely worth celebrating, and would not be possible without the hard work from our dedicated teachers:

**NAPLAN results:** Our school has always had a proud history of performing well above state average results. Therefore our school looks more closely at the results and data comparisons we have to other schools in our community and nearby suburbs. This unique data set gave us lots of things to celebrate such as

- For the second year in a row, our Year 3 students produced reading results that were above other schools in our community and nearby suburbs. 39.4% of our students achieved Exceeding, the highest band.
- Our Year 5 students produced reading results that were also above other schools in our community and nearby suburbs. A very impressive total of 46.7% of our students achieved Exceeding, the highest band.
- In numeracy, 21.5% of our Year 3 students achieved Exceeding, the highest band. This was only slightly below the number of students in our surrounding community and nearby suburbs.
- As for our Year 5 students, they showed significant growth in numeracy (in comparison to last year) with 25% students achieving the Exceeding band.



**Check In results:** Students in grades 3 to 6 also participate in another assessment process later in the year, called Check In. As the name suggests, the assessment serves to track students' performances in between NAPLAN assessments and helps teachers to plan future lessons accordingly. Just like NAPLAN, we perform well above stage averages and therefore compare ourselves to students' achievements with schools in our community and surrounding suburbs.

- In reading, a high proportion of our Year 3, Year 4 and Year 6 students produced results above other students in surrounding schools and suburbs. Our Year 5 students also maintained the competitive edge as they attained results that were on par with students in nearby schools and communities.
- In numeracy, our Year 3 and Year 4 students continue to lead the way as they attained scores above students in nearby schools and communities. Our Year 5 students achieved results that were close to their peers from other schools in nearby communities.




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## **PSSA Girls touch football**


