Communicating with Staff

The school has listened!!! We are responding to feedback from previous years through parent surveys and discussions with our community around communication and payment platforms. The executive and administration teams are currently hard at work investigating ways to streamline our communication channels/ platforms. In the meantime, to ensure a collaborative and supportive learning environment for your child, it's important for us to establish clear communication channels. To facilitate effective communication between families and our teaching staff, we've outlined the following expectations:



Email Correspondence: We encourage parents to reach out to their child's class teacher via email for any academic, behavioural, or social concerns or celebrations, or to schedule appointments. Our teachers are committed to responding promptly to your enquiries. If the matter is complex and requires detailed discussion, rest assured that we'll arrange a phone call or a face-to-face meeting to address it comprehensively. While our teachers prioritise being present in the classroom during instructional hours, we recognise the importance of addressing parent queries in a timely manner. Please note that emails will be checked and responded to within 48 hours and often outside of school hours.

Pickup Arrangements: It's imperative that your child is aware of their daily pickup arrangements. In the event of any unforeseen changes, please notify the school office promptly. While we understand that emergencies may arise, we kindly request that changes in pickup plans not become a regular occurrence to ensure the safety and well-being of all students and that disruption to learning time is minimised.

Absence Reporting: Should your child be absent from school on a particular day, we ask that you promptly notify the school office via email at bondi-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au. This helps us maintain accurate attendance records and ensures the safety of our students.

Dojo: While our school utilises Dojo, please note that it is only for one-way communication and the message function is not being utilised. For any communication with teachers, we kindly ask that you utilise email as the primary method. To keep you informed about classroom activities, our teachers will regularly post highlights, reminders, and updates on the class story. This also can promote dialogue around learning at home, strengthening the partnership between home and school.

General Assistant Update

This year we welcome Mr Mark Henderson to Bondi as our new permanent, full-time General Assistant (G.A). Mark was the successful applicant following a recruitment process - congratulations Mark! A huge thank you to Isaiah and Wiremu who stepped in as casual G.A.s over the past year.



NAPLAN

Every year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses the literacy and numeracy skills of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9.



NAPLAN tests are one aspect of each school's assessment and reporting process and do not replace the extensive, ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance. Each teacher will have the best insight into their students' educational progress. Parents/carers can use NAPLAN reports, along with other school assessment reports, to discuss their child's strengths and areas for improvement with their teacher. NAPLAN results do not measure overall school quality.

A massive thankyou to the P&C and Waverley Council and their Environmental Grant for the purchase of our new bin enclosures. They have beautified the playground immeasurably.

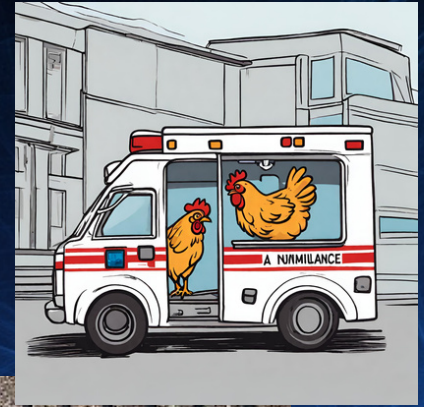
A message from the office staff

School uniform

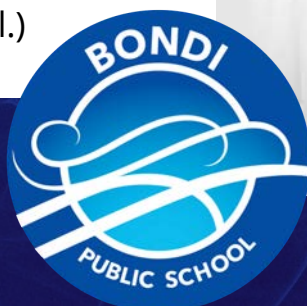

Behaviour code for students

NSW public schools

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive and responsive learning environments for everyone. We teach and model the behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected to:

- Respect other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- Follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- Strive for the highest standards in learning
- Respect all members of the school community and show courtesy to all students, teachers and community members
- Resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- Comply with the school's uniform policy or dress code
- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Respect all property
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into our schools
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against anyone in our schools

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions

Promoting the learning, wellbeing and safety of all students in NSW Public Schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity
- Speak and behave courteously
- Cooperate with others
- Develop positive and respectful relationships and think about the effect on relationships before acting
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others
- Dress appropriately by complying with the school uniform or dress code
- Take care with property

Safety

- Model and follow departmental, school and/or class codes of behaviour and conduct
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions
- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

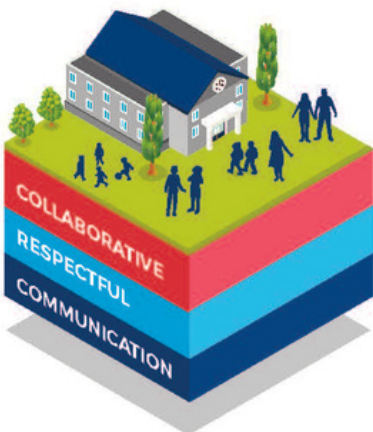

- Professional relationships with school staff are based on transparency, honesty and mutual respect.
- To be treated fairly. Tolerance and understanding are promoted as we respect diversity.

Respectful communication is a right

In all workplaces people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensive behaviour has no place in our school communities.

To ensure the wellbeing of students, staff and the community in our schools, steps will be taken to address unacceptable behaviour. This may include restricting contact with the school community or, in more serious cases, referral to NSW Police.



Unacceptable behaviour may include but is not limited to:

- Aggressive or intimidating actions, such as violence, threatening gestures or physical proximity.
- Aggressive or intimidating language, including the use of obscenities, making sexist, racist or derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- Treating members of the school community differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.
- Inappropriate and time wasting communication.

Let's talk about homework

Homework! By definition it is a noun that describes a set of tasks set by a teacher for students to complete at home. By association, many children around the world would unite and agree that homework is in fact nothing but 'the devil's work'. Nothing but torture, a strategically designed evil plan created by teachers to ensure children miss their favourite T.V shows and meddle with their social lives. There is some truth to this. Homework is in fact a strategically designed plan created by teachers...however our intention is not to meddle but improve children's education outcomes. Let's unpack this a little further.



Why should I insist on my child completing homework?

Homework gives your child a chance to:

- Revise and consolidate knowledge or skills they have learnt at school.
 - **Benefits:** Repeated practice is required before a skill or the application of new knowledge is moved to their long term memory. This makes room in their working and short term memory to ensure they can continue to learn new things.
- Develop independent work habits, accountability and ownership of their learning.
 - **Benefits:** It installs children with healthy work habits, organisation skills and prepares them for the transition to high school and beyond.
- It gives you a chance to get involved and help your child's learning.
 - **Benefits:** A well known African proverb says it best; *'it takes a village to raise a child'*. Teachers need your help as much as you need ours. Together, we are 'the village'.

How can I set my child or children up for success?

Children must do their own work

They won't learn anything if you do it for them. Give your children suggestions, strategies and directions - not answers!

Be a motivator and monitor

Ask about your child's homework, check it has been completed to a high standard, make yourself available for questions and concerns.
