Attendance

Regular school attendance is essential for academic success, enabling students to engage in learning, develop crucial life skills, and form relationships within the school community. While student illness can be unavoidable, and we thank families for keeping students home when they are unwell, it's important to recognise that attendance plays a key role in academic achievement and social-emotional



well-being, laying the groundwork for future success. This term we are introducing an in-class acknowledgement for students with 100% overall attendance for Term 2. We have **48** students at BPS who have been at school **all day, every day** this term.

Road Safety

Ensuring that students get to school safely is a critical concern for parents, educators, and communities. With increasing traffic and distractions, road safety measures such as pedestrian crossings, school zones, and awareness campaigns have become essential. These efforts not only protect children but also promote a sense of community responsibility. A few points on how to support your child to get to school safely:

Children travelling to school:

Getting to and from school may pose some new challenges for you and your child, particularly as your child becomes older. It is crucial to plan and talk about safe travel to and from school with your child if there are going to be changes made. You may see your child seeking more independence and therefore proposing more responsibility to be taken on. These changes may see your child travelling to school by themselves for the first time or using public transport. It is important that you are always aware of safety messages and sharing them whenever you are out and about. It is crucial that adults model safe and correct use of paths, roads and crossings at all times - getting somewhere safely always overrides punctuality.

If your child is a pedestrian:

- Plan a safe route together
- Discuss the safety precautions that should be considered during this route
- Always cross roads at pedestrian crossings or traffic lights
- Have a plan if your child does not feel safe on their trip
- Be aware of potential dangers and distractions if your child is walking to and from school with friends
- Set expectations around school/home arrival times

If your child is travelling by car with you:

- Arrange a safe place to pick them up and drop them off
- Always drop them off in designated drop off and pick up areas
- Actively supervise your child when entering the school grounds to ensure they arrive safely
- Make sure your child uses the Safety Door (rear kerb-side door) to get in and out of the car
- Always cross at pedestrian crossings or at traffic lights Never call your child across the road

If your child is travelling by public transport:

- Plan the route and transport to be taken
- Discuss safety precautions to be taken when taking public transport
- Always wait in a safe area
- Have a plan if your child misses their transport
- Discuss pedestrian safety (as above) as they will more than likely also be required to travel part of the journey by foot

Child Protection Education - Term 3

Next term, students in the years K-6 will be involved in mandatory lessons around child protection education as part of the PD/H/PE curriculum. Some of the content taught in child protection education deals with sensitive issues. The school will teach this content in an age appropriate way - this looks different for each grade/stage. 







Additional Programs and Opportunities

Next term, students will have the opportunity to participate in the ICAS assessments. ICAS is an historic academic competition that has been sat by over 10 million school students from 16,000 schools across 41 countries since 1981. Bondi Public school is offering:

- 3. Enter your child's details, select the subject areas your child would like to participate in, then proceed to payment.

Tell Them From Me

This term, our school is taking part in the Tell Them From Me student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them.



As well as providing our school with feedback from our students, the survey has a broader purpose. It provides the Department of Education with insights into student wellbeing, engagement, and effective teaching practices for ongoing school improvement. This is done by using non-identifying student data from across NSW. This survey is confidential, and staff in schools will not be able to identify individual students from their responses.

If any survey questions make your child uncomfortable, your child can skip the question or can choose to stop the survey at any time. If you do not want your child's responses to be included in the survey, please contact the school.

NCCD

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. 2H with Miss Hill

It has been an exciting and enriching term for 2H as we have delved into various areas of learning with enthusiasm and creativity.

In English, we embarked on a journey of storytelling through fables. Using the narrative mountain, students have crafted imaginative tales that teach valuable lessons. We explored the power of language with onomatopoeia and crafted vivid scenes using simple, compound, and complex sentences. Additionally, we have learnt to engage the reader using alliteration and expanded our vocabulary with tier 2 and 3 words, ensuring our writing captivates and informs.

In mathematics, students have been busy forming groups and mastering the art of arrays. Fried Rice Lettuce Cups

SERVINGS: 4 PREPPING TIME: 25 MIN COOKING TIME: 30 MIN

Ingredients

- 6 eggs
- 3 tbsp light soy sauce
- 2 cm knob of ginger, peeled and finely chopped
- 2 tbsp sunflower oil
- 4 cups cooked rice
- 8 spring onions, finely chopped
- 2 silverbeet leaves, finely chopped
- 1 small red onion, peeled and finely chopped
- 1 small carrot, julienned or grated
- 30 small whole lettuce leaves

Directions

- 1. Prepare all of the ingredients based on the instructions in the ingredients list.
- 2. Beat the eggs in the small bowl with 1 tbsp soy and the ginger.
- 3. Heat the wok with 1 tbsp sunflower oil.
- 4. Pour in the egg mixture and leave to cook partway before folding onto itself and cooking through.
- 5. Remove the egg from the wok and allow it to cool on the chopping board, then slice it.
- 6. Heat the remaining sunflower oil in the wok.
- 7. Add onion, carrot and spring onions and cook for 2 minutes, then add rice and remaining soy sauce.
- 8. Reduce the heat and add the silverbeet and cooked egg slices. Combine ingredients, then remove the wok from the heat.
- 9. Divide between serving platters for each table.
- 10. Provide each table with a platter of washed lettuce leaves. Diners place the rice in the leaves, roll and eat.





Carrot Muffins with Garlie Butter

SERVINGS: 10 PREPPING TIME: 25 MIN COOKING TIME: 30 MIN

Ingredients

Carrot Muffins

- 225 g flour
- 1.5 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 carrot, grated
- 60 g sharp, tasty cheese
- 2 tablespoons parsley (leaves from about 6 to 8 stems)
- 1 cup milk
- 3 tablespoons sunflower oil
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons grated parmesan for sprinkling on top

Directions

- Preheat the oven to 180°C fan-forced.
- Prepare all the ingredients based on the instructions in the ingredients list.
- Place 10 paper muffin cases in the muffin pan.
- Put flour, baking powder, and salt into a medium-sized bowl. Stir to mix using a big spoon.
- Add the carrot, tasty cheese and parsley to the bowl and mix.
- Combine milk and oil in the jug.
- Using a whisk, lightly beat the egg in a small bowl and add to the buttermilk and oil.
- Make a well in the dry ingredients. Tip in all the liquid. Using a fork and big sweeping movements, bring all the dry ingredients and the liquid together. Mix well, but do not over mix or the muffins will be tough.
- Without delay, spoon mix into each paper case, filling them two-thirds full.
- Finish with a good sprinkle of parmesan cheese.
- Bake for about 20 minutes until firm to the touch.
- Once they are ready, allow muffins to cool a minute before lifting them out onto a wire rack to cool further.

For the garlic butter:

- Peel the garlic and finely chop with a few grains of salt.
- Work the garlic into the butter with a fork.
- Scoop into a small bowl and serve alongside the muffins.

Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.

AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection.

Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

Get ready to Halloweenify all those wonderful toys you donated and be sure not to wear your Sunday best!




