Spotlight on Learning

3D with Mr Fin Dempsey

3D have had an action-packed Term 3! In the last few weeks, we've experienced a wave of paper crane mania in our class. Many students have been deeply engaged in following and analysing instructional texts to master the art of folding origami paper cranes. This creative endeavour was inspired by our reading of *Sadako and the 1000 Paper Cranes* by Elanor Coerr, where we explored the moving story of Sadako Sasaki.

In our literacy groups, we've taken a deeper dive into the 'Rowanverse' by continuing the Rowan series by Emily Rodda. We've carried on with the story and are now exploring the next adventure in our reading groups, Rowan and the Travellers. The students are excited to continue this captivating series!

In maths, we are focusing on representing numbers and exploring the relationships between fractions, decimals, and percentages. Students are developing a deeper understanding of how these concepts connect and apply in real-life situations. We are also focusing on mass and volume, where students are learning to measure, compare, and calculate using these key concepts.

In our geography lessons, students have been researching countries of their choice. They've also created dioramas that depict scenes from their selected countries, with a strong focus on the natural features of those regions.

We are looking forward to a great end to term 3, and even more learning in term 4!








Extra Curricular and HPGE with Mr Forbes and Mr Maslanka

Maths Olympiad

Throughout the year, a select group of 22 students have been training and competing in both the Maths Olympiad and the Maths Games competitions along with thousands of other HPGE groups of students throughout the state. As a group, the students scores have reflected wonderful improvements throughout the 4 rounds of competition as wonderfully visible below in our graphed averages across the year:



A wonderful effort by all students, and special recognition goes to our top 3 ranked students in each competition:

- In the Maths Olympiad, 1st place went to Will C, 2nd to Rex W, and tied in 3rd place was Archie M, Max J, Hugo H, Cooper C and Sage G.
- In the Maths Games 1st place went to Will C, tied in 2nd place is Wren B and Cooper C and tied in 3rd place is Teddy K and Sage G.

Animal Clues Competition - State wide

This term in Science and Library lessons, all stage 2 and 3 students competed in a research challenge run by the Awabakal Environmental Education Centre. The challenge integrates technology, research and language skills, in the areas of geography and science. Students from all around the state compete and are challenged to find the names of 16 organisms using mixed up sets of clues over four weeks. Each Monday, students download 24 jumbled clues related to a wetland theme. The students had until Friday to sort the clues to find and match with four wetland organisms.

From the 47 schools statewide in the competition, our *Stage 3 team* called the 'Beasts' came out with the perfect score and *topped the state!* They got a special shout-out recognition on the competition website (seen below), after even managing to assign the correct scientific names to each organism. A phenomenal achievement.

Carrot Soup

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp butter
- 1 large leek, sliced
- 800g carrots, roughly chopped
- 2 tsp honey
- 2 bay leaves
- 1.5 litres vegetable stock
- salt and pepper, to taste
- Greek yogurt, to serve

Directions

- Prepare the ingredients as in the ingredients list
- Melt the butter in a large saucepan over a medium heat. Add the leeks to the pan, then cook for 3 mins until starting to soften.
- Add the carrots, honey, and bay leaf, then cook for 2 mins.
- Pour in the stock, bring to the boil, then simmer for about 30 mins.
- Remove the bayleaves, and blend the soup in the pot using an immersion blender. Season to taste.
- Ladle into cups to serve. Add a swirl of Greek yoghurt.

Serves: 6

Time: 10 minutes prep, 35 minutes cooking



Alphabet Grissini

Ingredients

- 400 g plain flour, plus extra for dusting
- 1 tbsp instant dry yeast
- ½ tsp salt, plus extra for sprinkling
- 1 cup lukewarm water
- 1 tbsp olive oil, plus extra for greasing
- ½–1 tbsp fresh seasonal herbs, finely chopped
- 1 handful of sesame, poppy or fennel seeds, optional

To make the grissini letters;

- Preheat the oven to 200°C.
- Line the baking trays with baking paper.
- Tip the risen dough onto a clean, dry, lightly floured workbench. Add the fresh herbs to the dough and knead briefly.
- Divide the dough in half and wrap one half in plastic wrap.
- Cut the other half into 15 equal pieces. Roll each piece into a rope about 30 cm long and 5 mm thick.
- Shape the dough ropes into the alphabet letters of choice. Using a butter knife, cut pieces of rope as needed to make the various parts of the letter. The alphabet letters can be constructed directly on the baking trays.
- Sprinkle the letters with salt and, if using, seeds or spices.
- Repeat the process with remaining dough.
- Bake for 10–15 minutes until the grissini is firm to the touch.
- Remove the baking trays from the oven and allow the grissini to cool a little on the trays before moving to a
 wire rack.
- Once completely cool, serve or store in an airtight container (for up to 2 or 3 days).

Directions

To make the dough;

- Place the flour, yeast and the salt into a large bowl.
- Create a well in the centre of the flour.
- Pour the water and oil gently into the well.
- Use your hands to incorporate the water and oil into the flour, until the dough clings together and feels springy.
- Turn the dough onto a clean, dry, floured workbench and knead for at least 8 minutes, until the dough looks smooth.
- Grease the inside of a large bowl with the extra olive oil, then put the dough into the oiled bowl.
- Cover the bowl with a clean, dry tea towel and leave in a warm, protected spot until the dough has doubled in size, at least 1 hour




