New intercom on gates

We are pleased to have increased security in the form of intercom access on the Wellington St and Moore St gates during class time. We are ironing out a few bugs in the new system so please be patient while this happens. There is a sliding gate on Wellington St near the car park which will allow easy access for prams and wheelchairs. This gate will be open in the morning before school and again at 2:45pm. The same opening hours will apply to the Moore St gate near the car park entrance. During school hours you can access both gates by buzzing the intercom and the gate will be released. It is important that you come to the office first if you visit during school hours. You will also need to have the gate released before you leave during school hours so please come back to the office to have the gate reopened. It is slightly longer process but the added security is good for student safety.

Trading, selling and swapping

It has come to my attention that children are selling small trinkets to each other, sometimes for 'charity' and there is lively interest and participation. All these items can be lost, stolen, damaged and lead to problems. There is plenty to keep children occupied at school without bringing extra things to school. Please also encourage children to wear the school uniform as they do look so smart when everyone does.

Excursion costs

We base the cost of excursions on an average for the total cost of ALL students attending. If you are on leave when the excursion occurs we still have to pay for the bus and the admission fee even if you don't attend. We cannot build in an added cost to factor in absences as this is unfair to those bearing the added cost. This is the reason the excursion cost appears on your invoice even if you are absent on the day.

Re: Irrigation Works - Dickson Reserve

To ensure that Council can continue to improve the quality of public spaces to the local community for outdoor enjoyment, necessary irrigation works will be undertaken at Dickson Reserve, Bondi. Irrigation works will commence on Wednesday 15 August and are expected to be completed by late August/early September 2018. Works will occur on Monday to Friday, 7am – 5pm and Saturdays, 8am – 1pm (if required).

Works will include:

- Trenching and excavation works
- Supply and installation of irrigation control system
- Reinstating the turf


